## International Webinar, broadcast worldwide His Excellency R.N.Ravi's address

The Auroville Foundation, together with La Grace Center, USA, conducted a series of webinars on various topics around Auroville during the festival week.

Several Governing Board members and International Advisory Council members participated, together with many eminent people from India & around the world with a connection to spirituality, Mother and Sri Aurobindo.

On the 25th of February, His Excellency Shri R.N.Ravi himself participated with a recording on the topic "Practical Manifestation of the City and the role of the Government of India and UNESCO"

Remarkably, he explained to his audience the raison d'être of Auroville, the vision of its Founders, and delved into the spiritual goal of the Integral Yoga.

His speech revealed a remarkable understanding of the philosophy behind Auroville, the role of the Government of India, and a dedication to playing his role to the fullest.

He began by acknowledging the Auroville Festival 2022:

"I would like to thank and congratulate everyone associated with this festival, especially the Secretary of Auroville Foundation, Tirumati Jayanti Ravi, who has been driving this very, very passionately."

He went on to describe the mission of Auroville: "Friends, this City of Auroville - you may call it a village of Auroville - is essentially a Dream of the Mother, is to practically realize the vision of Sri Aurobindo, the vision of creating a set of people who are committed to the service of the Divine Consciousness."

He elaborates on the term *Divine Consciousness* thus: "Is the Divine Consciousness going to temples, mosques, churches, synagogues and going through the rituals of religion? No. It is a spiritual exercise."

Explaining extensively the vision of Sri Aurobindo and the process which has led humanity thus far, he makes the following observations on Human Unity: "Rishi Arvind thought that the next destiny of human beings is to reach that level of superconsciousness (...) In the Vedic period, *Mahamānavs* were those Rishis, those sages who reached that stage. Because when you reach that stage, you see the Unity of the entire creation. (...) Then, the differences, the anarchy of ideas and ideologies dissolves. It's like a light, falling on darkness."

On the role of the Aurovilians and that of the Government of India in the furthering of Auroville, he clarified: "Unfortunately we have seen a large number of groups, factions [in Auroville]... now these are all at a very subordinate level. It is not the level which Sri Aurobindo had imagined or envisioned. We are still trapped at a very very subordinate level. It has to evolve. But this evolution cannot be done by the government. What the Government of India can do, has to do, and will do: the physical aspect of it. Because Mother had given a design of what the township should be like. To see that that design - what we call town planning - is to manifest, is to be created. That is, a physical infrastructure of a township, where the potential Mahamānavs will be sitting, dwelling on that issue of going up to that higher level of consciousness and setting an example for the rest of the world."









## In fond memory: words from Sanjeev Agarwal

On popular demand from many Aurovilians, we will publish recent blogs of Sanjeev in this and subsequent editions. Sanjeev recently left his physical body on the 23rd of February. His blogs were on Auroville and its recent developements. His clarity and alacrity were remarkable, and he will be missed!

Sanjeev wrote, on the 7th of February 2022:

"I share with you a few random thoughts that float in and out of my mind during the last days.

1. While ruminating, about how we would go about building a township which entailed so many difficult tasks like acquiring lands, raising large amount of funds, hiring all the necessary professionals, and so many other works that need to be done – it seemed obvious to me that this can only be done with the active help of the government.

It also seems clear that the Mother has now decided to make the building of the township a priority and has therefore brought in the necessary government officials. I see a clear shift from one phase of Auroville to another. Like there was a shift from the management by the Sri Aurobindo society to management by Aurovilians themselves, now there is a 2nd shift towards focus on the building of the township with Govt. involvement. Because there is no other way that it can be done.

2. It has become clear that a few people wanted to block the implementation of the master plan of Auroville. This was done by placing the Youth Center kitchen in the way of the Crown road. It is known who these people are. Some of them have even confessed to doing so, Included in this group are the politicians who have forced the youth to retract many times from agreeing to move the Youth Center. The question that comes to my mind is whether it is all right for such people to continue to live in Auroville without so much as even an apology – at least an apology to the Mother. Not only do they continue to live in Auroville but also continue to propagate their own vision of what Auroville should be which is quite distinct from the indications given by the Mother for her project. I'm sure the Mother will do what is necessary to remedy this situation.

3. The 3rd thought that keeps running through my mind is what to do with the people who are not at all aligned with the vision of Sri Aurobindo and the Mother. To understand this vision is not easy---I am well aware of that. Probably we need to at least ensure that the basic guidelines given by Her are followed."

# Words of the Mother on India and the City of the Future

"India has become the symbolic representation of all the difficulties of modern mankind. "India will be the land of its resurrection—the resurrection to a higher and truer life." And the clear vision: the same thing which in the history of the universe made the earth the symbolic representation of the universe so as to concentrate the work on one point, the same phenomenon is now taking place: India is the representation of all human difficulties on earth, and it is in India that the... cure will be found. And then, that is why — THAT IS WHY I was made to start Auroville.

"It's sure to work, I KNOW it exists — the city [Auroville] is already there (it has been for many, many years). Interestingly, my creation was with Sri Aurobindo in the center, then when Sri Aurobindo left, I let it all rest, I didn't budge anymore. Then it suddenly started coming again, as if to say, "Now is the time, it must be done." Very well. The Muslims would say, "It's fated." It's fated, it's sure to exist. I don't know how much time it will take, but it seems to be going fast.

The city already exists.
