

The supreme Form is then made visible. It is that of the infinite Godhead whose faces are everywhere and in whom are all the wonders of existence, who multiplies unendingly all the many marvellous revelations of his being, a world-wide Divinity seeing with innumerable eyes, speaking from innumerable mouths, armed for battle with numberless divine uplifted weapons, glorious with divine ornaments of beauty, robed in heavenly raiment of deity, lovely with garlands of divine flowers, fragrant with divine perfumes. Such is the light of this body of God as if a thousand suns had risen at once in heaven. The whole world multitudinously divided and yet unified is visible in the body of the God of Gods. Arjuna sees him, God magnificent and beautiful and terrible, the Lord of souls who has manifested in the glory and greatness of his spirit this wild and monstrous and orderly and wonderful and sweet and terrible world, and overcome with marvel and joy and fear he bows down and adores with words of awe and with clasped hands the tremendous vision. "I see" he cries "all the gods in thy body, O God, and different companies of beings, Brahma the creating lord seated in the Lotus, and the Rishis and the race of the divine Serpents. I see numberless arms and bellies and eyes and faces, I see thy infinite forms on every side, but I see not thy end nor thy middle nor thy beginning, O Lord of the universe, O Form universal. I see thee crowned and with thy mace and thy discus, hard to discern because thou art a luminous mass of energy on all sides of me, an encompassing blaze, a sunbright fire-bright Immeasurable. Thou art the supreme Immutable whom we have to know, thou art the high foundation and abode of the universe, thou art the imperishable guardian of the eternal laws, thou art the sempiternal soul of existence."

This last cry of Arjuna indicates the double intention in the vision. This is the figure of the supreme and universal Being, the Ancient of Days who is for ever, sanātanam puruşam purāņam, this is he who for ever creates, for Brahma the Creator is one of the Godheads seen in his body, he who keeps the world always in existence, for he is the guardian of the eternal laws, but who is always too destroying in order that he may new-create, who is Time, who is Death, who is Rudra the Dancer of the calm and awful dance, who is Kali with her garland of skulls trampling naked in battle and flecked with the blood of the slaughtered Titans, who is the cyclone and the fire and the earthquake and pain and famine and revolution and ruin and the swallowing ocean. And it is this last aspect of him which he puts forward at the moment. It is an aspect from which the mind in men willingly turns away and ostrich-like hides its head so that perchance, not seeing, it may not be seen by the Terrible. The weakness of the human heart wants only fair and comforting truths or in their absence pleasant fables; it will not have the truth in its entirety because there there is much that is not clear and pleasant and comfortable, but hard to understand and harder to bear. The raw religionist, the superficial optimistic thinker, the sentimental idealist, the man at the mercy of his sensations and emotions agree in twisting away from the sterner conclusions, the harsher and fiercer aspects of universal existence. Indian religion has been ignorantly reproached for not sharing in this general game of hiding, because on the contrary it has built and placed before it the terrible as well as the sweet and beautiful symbols of the Godhead. But it is the depth and largeness of its long thought and spiritual experience that prevent it from feeling or from giving countenance to these feeble shrinkings. (to be continued next week)

COVID-19 UPDATE

From the WC/Covid-19 Task Force - As you may be aware, the number of COVID positive cases has increased in the last days in Pondicherry while going down in our district(currently 41 active cases in Pondy and 34 in Villupuram district). <u>Due to this we once again urge you all to not go to Pondy city except for essential needs</u>. While it is good news that the cases in Villupuram district are decreasing, we must remain vigilant in our daily lives and the choices we make. Since there have been relaxations around us in the Lockdown 4.0 phase, notably that some domestic travel has been allowed, the risk of spread of the virus is increasing once again. Since people have started traveling again, even minimally, there has been an increase in cases in India, and it is **likely to peak around the end of July here** (sources: WHO, and corroborated in a recent interview by Dr. Randeep Guleria, Director of AIIMS (New Delhi) & Advisor to Govt of India on Covid-19).

Some residents who have been stranded in other parts of India are now returning to Auroville. There are strict protocols that have been put in place for any mode of domestic travel, and everyone coming from Chennai or other parts of India must be in 14 day home quarantine. For those repatriated from abroad it is likely they will be tested and have to be in institutional quarantine for 7 days at the point of arrival. We request anyone who is planning to return to please inform us, if you haven't done so already, so that we may be prepared to support you during the quarantine period, if needed.

As of 1st June, new guidelines have come from the Central and State governments. We have begun meetings this week with various stakeholders of particular areas of work in Auroville, in order to discuss in more detail what can be relaxed and how to do so in a responsible way, taking into account Auroville's particular concerns, needs and context. Further announcements with the outcome of these meetings, namely Auroville specific guidelines, will be circulated soon. Below is a summary of what will remain unaffected/restricted in the state until further notice:

- Public gatherings of any kind are still not allowed.
- Theaters, gyms and swimming pools are still to remain closed.
- Schools, educational and research activities are still to remain closed.
- Sports ground & playgrounds to remain closed.
- Religious places are still to remain closed.
- Until June 8th, restaurants can still only offer takeaway and delivery. (After June 8th it is likely they can resume table service based on the guidelines that will be released soon with limited occupancy)
- Auroville will remain closed for outstation tourists, visitors, volunteers, interns and new employees. (If there are cases of individuals who have been living in the immediate area since before the lockdown and can show evidence of this, the Working Committee will consider requests to move to Auroville accommodation and register as guests/volunteers of Auroville on a case by case basis.)
- No cash transactions inside of Auroville, only PT accounts and Aurocard.

Activities that are allowed to function from June 1st are as follows:

- E-commerce activities for all items (outside of Chennai).
- All business activities, with 100% employees, following all protocols/SOP's for the workplace. Wherever possible work from home should be encouraged.
- Taxis and private vehicles can travel within the district, without e-pass.
- Public transport within districts, but not crossing district or state boundaries.

Please remember that all cautionary measures to avoid the risk of spread of the virus must still be respected by us all (masks in public places, frequent washing of hands with soap and water or use of hand sanitizer, physical distancing, etc.). SOP's (Standard Operating Procedures) have been prepared for construction activities, food/grocery outlets, offices and other workplaces, and are available with the Covid-19 Task Force. If you have any specific questions or concerns, please write to our 2 groups and we will do our best to respond.

We take this opportunity to express our gratitude for the continuing support and understanding and patience that is being extended during this time. Although there are many challenges, this can also be seen as an opportunity for reflection and progress, both on an individual and collective level, since it is expected that the Coronavirus will not go away any time soon and we will have to live with some of the changes in our lives for quite some time. ~ The Working Committee and Covid-19 Task Force

Now that (some) domestic flights are functioning again, the Tamil Nadu government has made strict regulations for travelers entering into Tamil Nadu. Travelers, on their arrival in a Tamil Nadu airport, shall show the details of registration at the TN e-Pass registration desk. Passengers without an entry TN ePass will not be permitted to move out without making the entry. District Collectors shall make available necessary facilities at the exit gates of airports to check and take follow-up action.

After undergoing medical screening for any symptoms of COVID-19, asymptomatic persons shall undergo home quarantine for 14 days. Travelers who register for institutional quarantine shall be sent for institutional quarantine at a Government or -aid facility. Those who do not have facilities for home quarantine would be sent to institutional quarantine.

Pick up vehicles will be permitted to enter the airport with one person (in addition to the driver), at a designated place subject to social distancing norms. If the person picking up the passenger comes into physical contact with the traveler, they shall also remain under home quarantine for 14 days. Among the mandatory infrastructural requirements at entry airports are: Temperature checking with Infrared thermometer, a proper queue system to reach the desks, disinfection of all luggage by airport authorities, use of PPEs, masks and protective gear by all officials directly dealing with passengers, and public address system to for informing passengers of the details.

From the Auroville Service Trust re: Nandini

In view of the recent communications regarding Nandini, the Service Trust and the ABS (Auroville Board of Services) is sharing the following information with the community. The executives of Nandini supported by our Trust and the ABS have presented a formal appeal to the Auroville Council against the intervention and decisions of the FAMC with regards to Nandini. This appeal is currently a work in progress.

We don't agree with the overruling of the decision of Service Trust, reached in close collaboration and agreement with the Auroville Council in late 2018, regarding the solution of the problems of Nandini, we are disheartened by the total lack of respect shown by the FAMC in dealing with the problems of Nandini towards their executives, and we are deeply concerned about the absence of any established procedure in taking decisions. We sincerely regret the entire history of how the FAMC has tried to "resolve" the problems of Nandini. Their actions establish a very hurtful and negative precedent and are another step in breaking down the collaborative atmosphere that should prevail in the resolutions of problems in the service sector. ~ Auroville Service Trust 24.05.2020

From the FAMC re: Code of Conduct

Now that the lockdown is slowly being lifted, the FAMC would like to revive the Code of Conduct review process. We had previously sent out communications to the community, which we are repeating below with a new timeline.

The Code of Conduct for Units and Trusts (COC) sets out the basic intention and procedures necessary to help us to grow and protect our economy and work towards fairness, transparency and accountability.

The FAMC, following its mandate, has been working on draft amendments to the current COC. It has undertaken this lengthy task because since 2017, when the current COC was implemented, we have seen a substantial need for its improvement both in terms of the principles it expresses and embodies, and in the processes it sets out.

We are happy to share the draft with the community at large for feedback before the COC's final document is put before the RA for ratification. This draft is a product of the consideration of extensive feedback from a wide pool of Aurovilians.

As the COC impacts all the sectors of our economy, we feel the need to form a Feedback Committee composed of 12 members and 1 facilitator, as follows:

- Av Service/Non Profit Trust -2 people from units within these Trusts (nominated by AV Service Trust, Auromitra, Village Action Trust, Bharat Nivs, CSR, NESS, SAIIER, Palayam Trust, Udhavi School, Health and Healing Trust)
- Surplus Generating Trusts 4 people (from Units within the Trusts not mentioned above, nominated by them);
- FAMC 2 members (to provide relevant background information);
- Community at large 2 members;
- BCC 2 members;
- Facilitator 1.

The responsibility of the Feedback Committee shall be to:

- Collate all of the feedback that shall come from the Community;
- Analyse all feedback received; and, where appropriate
- Give suggested amendments, to the draft COC for the FAMC and the feedback committee to consider with a view to coming up with a finalised draft for ratification by the RA.

Timeline:

- Feedback on the draft COC was invited by the FAMC from 14th of March for a period of three weeks. We have been collecting feedback since then, and now extend it until the 15 June 2020. This feedback is being gathered via a dedicated email address set up for this purpose: <u>cocfeedback@auroville.org.in</u> Hard copy feedback may also be given to FAMC Admin at the office on the 2nd floor in Town Hall.
- 2. The proposed COC 2020 (with the draft amendments) is available on Auronet and in Hard Copy at the FAMC Office and at the Auroville Library.
- 3. The Feedback Committee shall be constituted by 15 June 2020 by the FAMC and the Auroville Council.
- 4. From the time it is constituted (by 15th June) the Feedback Committee will have 6 weeks to complete their work.
- 5. Feedback obtained from the Feedback Committee shall be considered jointly by the Auroville Council, FAMC and the Feedback Committee within a period of three weeks in order to elaborate a final document.
- 6. The RAS shall conduct the RAD process with the final document arrived at.



The Svedam community borewell is running dry and not supplying enough water to the community. Drilling a new well is not a possibility. The only other measure is to buy water in tankers. To tide over the situation, and as an emergency measure, a pipe is being laid from the Auroshilpam water distribution network to the Svedam infrastructure line. This line is temporary and shall be shifted if required due to planning parameters in the future.



Migrant workers crisis Looking for Hindi-speaking volunteers

India grapples with migrant workers' exodus ...

As you all probably know, daily wage workers who have migrated across states to the cities are facing immense hardship due to the lockdown. Without a job for weeks now, they can't afford to pay for rent and face an imminent risk of starvation. Many, as you know, want to go back home and given the lack of travel options, try to walk for thousands of kilometres to get back home. The Supreme Court recently ruled twice in favour of stranded migrant workers.

Coast India (https://coastindia.org/), a national initiative of volunteers and NGOs, is committed to helping as many stranded migrant workers as it possibly can and as long as needed. Min, Siva, me and others in Auroville have been working on this issue for over a month. We work with data given to us by the Jharkhand government and seek to collaborate with Tamil Nadu govt. officials to help stranded Jharkhand migrants in this state.

Even if the lockdown is over on June 1, the work is likely to continue. Railways are putting out more special trains next month, but not to all destinations. We want to help everyone who is in need of basic relief and wants to go home. We need more volunteers who can speak Hindi and who can commit to at least 1-2 hours per day till end of June to make calls to migrant workers and help them with their needs. You should also be able to take initiative and have the ability to handle distress calls.

## COP 26: Good COP or Bad COP?

Smoke everywhere, people dying. No, we're not talking about the recent riots triggered by police in the USA killing black people. We're a

green column. Though it does make sense to combine social justice and environment policy. In fact, if the Corona crisis has taught us anything, it is that we're all in this man-made mess together. The word of the year might be "intersectionality" which refers to the overlapping layers of privilege and inequality that frame each inquiry into our complex reality. But if it's not the police, then which COP are we talking about?

The Conference of the Parties to the Paris Climate Agreement. The one that was postponed, and will now be held in Glasgow in November 2021. The multi-stakeholder platform Climate Action held a virtual panel COP26: A Decade to Deliver to discuss the impact of COVID-19 on climate change, environmental diplomacy in 2020, and what the delay to COP26 really means for our ability to tackle the climate emergency. We watched the hour-long video for you and here is an update.

As we habitually zoom into panel members home offices, most with serious bookshelves in the background, and one in his bedroom, there is one thing that stands out: decisions about recovery from COVID will move us from LOCK-DOWN to LOCK-IN. Where countries invest, which industries they bail out, will determine whether we will be locked into a scenario of increased carbon emissions or one of carbon descent. On social media the calls for #buildbackbetter and #greenrecovery are trending.

In the words of Alok Sharma, COP 26 President: "While we rightly focus on fighting the immediate crisis of the Coronavirus, we must not lose sight of the huge challenges of climate change. (...) The steps we take to rebuild our economies will have a profound impact on our societies' future sustainability, resilience and wellbeing and COP26 can be a moment where the world unites behind a clean, resilient recovery.'

Despite the delays due to the pandemic, "the race to the zerocarbon economy has already started and it's in part because of competitiveness", said Nigel Topping, who has the unique designation of UK High level Climate Action Champion. "In the summer last year, some of those commitments started to emerge, at the UN Secretary General's summit in September there were a few hundred, and between September and December the number doubled." Topping says he is "seeing more and more companies, cities and investors committing to net-zero, asking that governments match that ambition because it's something that everybody has to do together." At least it means we don't need to wait around for heads of state to see the Green Light...

Despite the temporary changes the pandemic has created, such as cleaner air and less pollution, emissions have only fallen by a maximum of 10%. Concentrations of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere are still going up, and they are higher than they've been for 2 or 3 million years. So will COP26 be a good COP? All participants believed so, but they realized they have a daunting task ahead in making climate action go as viral as COVID (source : climateaction.org )



#### TWELVE PILLARS IN THE CHAMBER OF MATRIMANDIR


The Vedic Rishis claim that there are seven bodies (koshas) in man, corresponding to seven worlds (planes of consciousness) in the universe. This arrangement enables man to have relations with the beings and forces in seven planes of consciousness in the universe.

The twelve pillars in the Matrimandir chamber represent the 'Thousand-pillared Home' in the over-mind (heaven). The Supreme Divine Shakti (Transcendental Mother) has created



overmental gods to help humanity to attain overmental truth, which serves true but limited creation. So man seeks the help of Supermind (divine Gnosis), the Selfdetermining infinite consciousness, which will liberate him from the struggle and suffering in life and usher him immortality.

Man is a mental being in a living body. His soul is capable of ascending through different planes of consciousness, whereas gods cannot do so, as they do not have soul in the evolving nature. Spiritual powers are delegated to them. They can increase their illumination (knowledge, light endless light no more darkness) to an infinite extent.



Saint Manickavasahar (900 C.E) follows Bhakti Yoga in his pursuit towards self-realisation. He compares the intellect of man to an elephant with two trunks; he is unable to find a definite solution for his problem. He intensifies his concentration on the heart centre (Anagatha) and becomes aware of his overmental kosha in his inner being. At the same time, he feels that he is one with the overmental plane of consciousness. 'Come to Chidambaram' is the 'Adesh' he received, but he is unable to fulfil it. Further concentration takes him to the limit of Vignanamaya kosha of his inner being. He becomes one with the supramental plane of consciousness and feels that all his suffering has been annulled, since the Self of supermind begins to govern all his activities. During this experience in Chidambaram, a small town in Tamil Nadu, he has noticed overmental gods in small groups worshiping the Self of super-mind along with him, with the intention to increase their illumination to an infinite extent. Impressed by the account of overmental gods given by many Saivite saints like Saint Manickavasahar, a Chola king built 'Ayiramgalmandapam', similar to 'Thousand- pillared Home' in heaven, in the temple premises of Chidambaram, exclusively for overmental gods.

Twelve pillars in Matrimandir serve two purposes. First, they inspire Aurovilians and others to ascend to overmind (heaven) to get overmental truth consciousness. Second, they remind them of the regular visits of overmental gods to Matrimandir to get the Truth Consciousness of the Transcendental Divine already fixed by the Mother (Ashram) at the bottom of Matrimandir. Mahalakshmi, Maheshwari, Mahasaraswathi and Mahakali are four aspects (powers) of the Supreme Mother. The Mother (Ashram) has brought down these powers and established them in four pillars of the Matrimandir respectively. Overmental gods, who are the regular visitors to Matrimandir in Auroville, are aware of this fact. They are able to receive the Truth Consciousness and increase their illumination to an infinite extent. The Mother expects that Aurovilians also could learn to receive the Truth Consciousness established at the bottom of Matrimandir.

#### It's So Simple!

It seems there are two forms of simplicity.

Firstly, the simplicity that comes from a superficial view of things. We hear it so often: "It's so simple, all you have to do is..."

Secondly, the simplicity that comes from depth, from cutting through the superfluous to grasp the underlying dynamics that are driving surface manifestations. An example of this would be Sri Aurobindo's statement regarding the real nature of the conflict that was being waged in the Second World War. "You should not think of it as a fight for certain nations against others or even for India," he wrote to a sadhak, "it is a struggle for an ideal that has to establish itself on earth in the life of humanity, for a Truth that has yet to realise itself fully and against a darkness and falsehood that are trying to overwhelm the earth and mankind in the immediate future."

The problem comes when we confuse the two types, and mistake superficial simplicity for depth simplicity.

This can happen at any time and in many different situations, but it is particularly problematic at present when, faced by so many unknowns, we are offered so many instant solutions -"COVID is a conspiracy of..." "Lockdowns don't work." "Take this to cure COVID," etc. - because in our yearning for quick, simple answers, we tend to grab at the ones that align with our existing predispositions and understanding and then proclaim these as the 'truth'.

It takes much more effort to step back, go deep, and try to understand that other, deeper level that deals with essentials, not symptoms. This may happen spontaneously, in meditation, for example, or through reading an apposite quote of Sri Aurobindo or Mother or other being of wisdom. But an intermediate phase may require us to do that hardest thing of all: to rest in doubt, to allow ourselves to know that we don't know.

For only when we've cleared the clutter of all our existing presuppositions and beliefs is there space for some deeper understanding to enter.
