

From the Residents Assembly Service

REMINDER - RESIDENTS ASSEMBLY DECISION- MAKING PROCESS RESTARTED - METHOD FOR SELECTING WORKING GROUP MEMBERS

This is to remind you that the Residents' Assembly Decision making process (RAD) to agree the method of selection for working group members is going on.

The selection for working group membership is due to take place before the end of the year as a number of existing members' terms are ending. With multiple proposals to be considered, this decision-making process first seeks consent from the community to deviate from the 50% in-favour threshold for agreeing the method of selection. If accepted, the proposal A (https://bit.ly/3emlzWa), B (https://bit.ly/34Ssh48) or D (https://bit.ly/2UzkbYr) that receives the most votes will be regarded as the community decision, even if that proposal gets less than 50% of votes in favor. If the community chooses to use the 50% decision-making threshold (as per the RAD policy 2007 (https://bit.ly/3jWCL74) default), it will require one of the proposals A, B or D to receive at least 50% of votes in favor to be registered as the community decision. If no proposal is successful in the first round, there will be further rounds to determine whether one of the proposals can reach 50% votes in favor. Further details are set out in the RAS emails.

Proposal C presented by ABC/ABS representatives was focused on the selection of a representative form of membership for FAMC, followed by a review of the mandate. With the expected formation of the FAMC mandate review Taskforce, which includes proposal C stakeholders, it has been decided to withhold proposal C from this RAD, pending assurances from the Auroville Council about the Taskforce. The FAMC mandate, including membership selection, is expected to be brought back to the community within 4 months, with an RAD on the proposal(s) for change.

WHAT ARE THE PROPOSALS ASKING FOR?

Proposal A (https://bit.ly/3emlzWa) replaces the method of selecting working group members currently set out in the PWG 2018 (https://bit.ly/3mQIQnc).

Proposal B (https://bit.ly/34TsUv0) replaces the full PWG 2018 (https://bit.ly/3mQIQnc) with the suggested method of selecting working group members.

Proposal D (https://bit.ly/2UzkbYr) replaces the method of selecting working group members currently set out in the PWG 2018 (https://bit.ly/3mQIQnc).

Call for a Design Evaluation Panel for Matrimandir

For many years, successive teams of Matrimandir executives have faced the need for a body which could evaluate proposed designs, in various fields, and give expert judgment on their suitability. There is a need to raise and widen the level of design experience. This need is felt in areas such as general safety, garden excellence, mechanical features concerning the structure of Matrimandir, pathways, lake shore, lighting, the amphitheatre and others. Questions arise frequently on new designs that call for an evaluation. It is for this purpose, we are making a call for qualified people to come forward who could form together a "Design Evaluation Panel" (DEP) to fill this gap in the overall functioning at Matrimandir. -

Re: loud and speeding bikes on Auroville roads Meeting on October 30th 2020

The Council and Working Committee had been receiving complaints from the community about speeding bikes, noisy bikes and late-night racing, so we invited a group of youth and parents for a facilitated exchange.

Key question: How can we together create a safe place for all? Members from AVC, WCom and Security voiced clearly all the concerns and an honest and creative dialogue followed.

EDUCATION: Classes/courses on traffic rules and regulations, dangers, responsibility, liabilities, can be held in the schools, best to start at 7th/8th grade. Eventually, a kind of driving school could be set up. Also, Newcomers and volunteers need to get the driving basics and how to behave on Indian roads.

Improvement of **INFRASTRUCTURE** to reduce dangerous driving (e.g. cutting curves/corners) on Auroville roads in general:

- Line in the middle of the street through the curves/corners to remind people to stay on the proper roadside.
- Road signs, for slowing down
- Speed breakers
- Convex mirror at road junctions

DRIVING, LEARNING & FUN - Driving field and Driving Track, to learn to drive well and also have fun. This would need a group of people to take it up and build and hold it in a responsible way.

We want to thank the youth and parents who showed up, and for the respectful and constructive discussion we had. This is a good beginning. If any of you have further ideas or would like to participate and help in either the driving/traffic classes or with the fun trek, please contact us. - Auroville Council

Auroville Council Report July, August and Sept 2020

Internal Functioning: The council in its new formation went through an intense team building process with weekly sessions over a two months span. The process was held by Elisa and

Suryamayi. Besides team dynamics including conflict management, it also taught us how to efficiently work together.

Resignation of two Council members: Dan and Siv resigned and standby members, Jayamurthy (La Ferme) and Anbu (Windarra) replaced them at the end of September. Anbu has since resigned.

Collaboration with Koodam: Koodam offered a series of learning sessions to the Council on the Conflict Resolution Policy. This included a diving into the policy as well as discussions on how to work together.

Coordination and collaboration with Mattram: The Council is continuing to meet regularly with Mattram to address common topics on mental wellness. There is work in progress with regard to caring for seniors with mental and other challenges. Additional efforts are being made to offer creative activities and social gatherings called "Hangout" for seniors. A survey has been conducted to organize activities that would be beneficial, enriching and entertaining to the aging population in Auroville. There is also ongoing work with Mattram in regard to counseling for people in debt. An awareness program is being prepared for Aurovilians and local employees that could bring a better understanding of the risks involved in taking loans at high interests, popularly in the form of Chit Funds.

People in Debt: The Council continues extending counselling and support in modest ways to people that are struggling with debt repayment & debt management, due to their involvement in Chit Funds and fast money-making schemes.

Selection Process: The Council has been marginally involved in the final preparation of the Selection process models presented to the community after the meetings in June when the process was rekindled.

MM Selection Process: The selection process for 3 new executives has been prepared and will soon be communicated. Simultaneously Matrimandir Executives asked the Council to look into the creation of a Design Evaluation Panel. In a collaborative effort with MM executives the form for the panel has taken shape. This panel will consist of 4 Aurovilians. We hope to soon present the proposal to the Community.

Auronet guidelines: After publishing the guidelines and harvesting a lot of feedback, the Council together with the working committee has studied and integrated the feedback. The document will be going for a RAD process.

Arbitrations: Sanjana: in process, presently all needed financial data are being collected.

Youth Center: In a meeting in February 2020 with the Youth Centre it was decided to look for some Aurovilians that would form a YC support group in order to help and support the YC in challenging situations and would act as liaison and possibly also in decision making processes. This group is now created. A mission statement and a set of guidelines for the Youth Center are being drafted.

Music and Noise: The Youth Center residents have been requested to respect the needs of Aurovilians living in the neighborhood and not play loud music after 10PM. They have agreed to initiate friendly conversations with neighbors and notify them when they intend to have a party.

African Pavilion: The new management used the quiet summer time to further clean up the premises and to do some gardening. Some unresolved issues in regard to projects started by the previous management team have come up and are being addressed. For this a new Africa Pavilion support team has been formed.

Dog Breeding / Dogs to be vaccinated / Pitbull: Again, in the last months there have been incidents with dogs attacking Aurovilians and outsiders at various places in Auroville. We urge all people who hold dogs, be it a watchdog, domesticated stray or a pet, to **vaccinate their animals** and to maintain a vaccination booklet that can be demonstrated in the unfortunate event of an incident/bite. We request all veterinary doctors, both Aurovilians and vicinity to follow this as it is stipulated in their professional protocol. Dog holders are fully responsible and

liable for the behavior of their dogs. They have to sustain or refund the cost of post exposure rabies vaccination and any damage caused. **Please also neuter your dogs**, males and females, so that we may have a chance in coping with the ever-multiplying dog population in Auroville. Be aware that dangerous breeds like Pit Bulls and Rottweilers should not be bred, sold and distributed in Auroville. These dogs, if not well trained and carefully attended to, tend to become a menace for humans and other animals.

Discipline Community: The FAMC met with challenges in creating a Selection Panel for the selection of a new steward for Discipline Farm due to interference from various sides. During summer the Council has been called numerous times to resolve smaller or bigger conflicts. Only when there is clarity on the new farm management can meaningful efforts on building peace between Discipline residents and farm be initiated.

New Creation: The Council had to deal with an issue related to an asset that is part of the Child Development Program and had been given/ used as accommodation. The issue is slowly being resolved. Housing has offered to the party staying in that particular part of the building another accommodation elsewhere in AV. Presently they are still staying in the NC CDP living quarter.

Hearing Aurovilians: The Council receives grievances of all kinds. After offering a hearing to the concerned individual or party an effort is made to indicate who (which Auroville Working Group or Activity) to address, or what actions could help and resolve the issue.

Housing Board Report for Sept/Oct 2020



8 HB Members are present during this period:

Rama Narayana (Entry Board), Prabhu (Community at large), Vivek (Green Group), Xavier (Community at large), Sreevatsa (L'avenir d'Auroville on TDC related topics only) Riju (AVC), Venkatesh (Housing Service), Savithri (Housing Service). 5 members constitute a quorum.

AV Council related matters:

Ana, New Creation - It was requested by AVC for HB/HS to find appropriate housing for Ana and her son due to an ongoing dispute with New Creation guest house. HB identified Pony Farm and Mukti as having suitable houses for Ana. Other issues not relating to housing rest with AVC.

L'avenir d'Auroville related matters:

Residential Zone 1&2 Draft - TDC gave a presentation to HS & HB on the Residential Zone 1&2 Draft, they requested & received feedback from both.

Topographic Survey of Promesse & Fraternity Communities - HB agreed to provide funds for TDC to carry out a survey of the Promesse & Fraternity communities in order to establish how many plots are available for future housing. The costs would be between Rs. 10000 - 20000 and could be recouped from future house transfers.

FAMC related matters:

Quorum on HB. FAMC has directed that, if there is not a quorum of HB members at any meeting, then the meeting notes are to be agreed after the meeting by those members who are not present.

Operations Manual. FAMC would like HB to put together an operation's manual to assist the functioning of Housing. A subgroup is to be formed between HS & HB to look after this matter.

Housing Board/Housing Service matters:

Separate Electricity Meters for Newcomer Housing - Separate electricity meters need to be installed in several communities where there are newcomer houses, as HS is often paying the full

bill for the community at present. These communities are Celebration, Aspiration and Courage, work has proceeded in Courage using AVES.

Simplicity - Mary has written requesting to be allocated bridge housing due to a number of reasons that makes the living situation in Simplicity unsuitable. Varuna eventually has plans to consolidate their privately-owned land with the Auroville land for a **desalination plan** there. HB made a visit on 25/09/20 to view the situation for themselves and agreed to provide the bridging house, after seeking assurances from Varuna that their long-term plans have not changed.

Celebration Tree Cutting Concerns were raised by neighbours of Celebration that extensive tree cutting was taking place beyond what was necessary. Work was halted whilst a visit from the HB was made to inspect the work that had already been carried out, and the work was finalised soon after that.

Kriya Electricity Bill Separate meters have been installed and were functioning from August. A request from the Kriya community to pay above the amount agreed by HB (5000 rs, or 30%, whichever is lower) for the last bill was turned down.

Account resolution to be signed by HB. The final accounts for Housing for the period 2019/2020 were studied by the Board and signed off by Prabhu on behalf of the Board as a whole.

Suguna Velu - Blocked Access. An urgent message was received from Suguna & Velu, living by the village in Edayanchavadi because a private landowner had blocked their access to their house and water. They managed to secure temporary access through a neighbours house but still have no access to water. Due to the urgency of the situation, temporary housing was arranged in the Celebration community.

Sundaramoorthy's house - family pooja. Sundaramoorthy's family requested & was granted to be able to collect some personal items from his house so that they could carry out a pooja on the anniversary of the families' death. WCom have agreed that the family can remove all the moveable items from the house in coordination with HS.

NC Stewardship agreements: HS asked HB to clarify if a Newcomer should have stewardship papers for their housing solution, as it was coming up on a few occasions that Newcomers were living in houses that were not mapped anywhere by TDC or Housing. It was agreed that they should, as papers can be drawn up in a short period of time. The cost of drawing up the papers would be borne by Housing.

Stewardship selection process: Sangeetha requested clarification about how a steward was selected for the ex-Peter's house in Prathana. The house had originally been presented to the community as suitable for a family but had finally been given to a couple. HB acknowledged that the house was presented incorrectly and this had led to the confusion. Discussions with community members had later revealed that the house had been extended without consideration to the amenities, and the water tank, which was shared, would not support a family. So although the sqm of the property was appropriate the facilities were not. The proximity of neighbors also had to be considered.

Housesitting request: Subramanian is an Associate of Auroville who is working as an accountant for several Aurovilian groups. His son attends an Auroville school. He requested to know if he was able to housesit an Auroville asset. It was felt that as he pays a contribution to Auroville he would be able to so long as his Auroville status remains current.

Staff Quarters at Dehashakti: HS asked for clarification as to whether SQ could be created at Dehashakti Sports Ground, as a few people have come to get a signature on their AVL form saying that they live at SQ there.

Need for additional members of HS, inc. a HS co-ordinator & financial contact. Due to Svenja leaving HS & HB there is a need for a HS co-ordinator & a financial contact to assist the smooth running of the HS office. It was agreed that this is necessary and HS should look at the available options.

Caretaker for Celebration Volunteer GH: Siggi left his position as caretaker at Celebration GH. A new caretaker will be recruited from the wider community, and criteria will be drawn up by HS.

Entry Topics:

Anbu/Promesse request- Anbu requested that he be allowed to continue to live in his newcomer housing in Promesse while being confirmed as an Aurovillian, as he is hoping to build a house there. The request was denied by the HB because it is against the policy agreed by the community, and it would set a future precedent. It was noted that Anbu has not yet received a NOC for the building of his house.

Pranshula request- The Entry Group & friends of Pranshula made a request to the Housing Board to decide on whether she could finish her Newcomer process and become Aurovillian whilst living outside Auroville in a local village. She has been unable to secure a suitable house inside Auroville due to her very particular set of family circumstances. The Board did not agree to make an exception because living inside Auroville is a key tenet of becoming an Aurovillian, and precedent should not be set that otherwise is possible.

House Checking Group - The Entry Service proposed that there should be a joint HS & ES house checking group, which would visit the home of all newcomers to ensure that they are living as they say they are. This was agreed so a sub group has been formed to go ahead with this new process.

Newcomer Applicants -The Housing Board sought clarity from the Entry Board about whether new applicants were being accepted for the Newcomer process, as this has a bearing on planning the newcomer housing supply. The Entry Board clarified the process was still closed but that they had 71 applicants waiting at present.

Tamara request - Tamara wrote to explain that she and her family were at the end of their newcomer process but have not been able to secure a house sitting despite searching for several months. She said that a number of Aurovillian houses were offered to her for high prices, outside of the correct house sitting process. The Housing Board declined the request, as this was against the policy of EB & HB and it would be setting a precedent, which has to be avoided if possible. It was noted that although there are a number of Newcomer houses empty at present, this situation is anticipated to change within the near future when the entry process opens up again.

House transfers, Stewardships and Evaluations - Assets left behind by an Aurovillian passing. The HB proposes that properties under the stewardship of Aurovillians who have passed away should be managed differently. Smaller houses that would be manageable for those with limited funds could be given as houses against recognised work (previously called pro bono housing), while larger houses could be transferred, with the funds received placed in a fund to assist those with housing needs in the future.

Re: House Sitting - A message was placed on Auronet & in N&N, reminding community members that if they leave AV for more than 3 months then they must arrange a house sitting. HS receive many reports, particularly from NC who are trying to arrange housesitting, that houses are left empty when their stewards leave for long periods. Doing this adds greatly to the housing crisis that Auroville is experiencing.

Repair and Maintenance - Message from BCC regarding funding during COVID. BCC wrote to HS & HB to inform them that there would be no budget for repairs & maintenance given for the 2020/2021 period. Instead they directed that HS utilise their 38 lakh Fraternity fund for emergency repairs only. BCC also directed that there is no budget for grants during this period either, but loans can be given in accordance with the normal processes of Housing.

Chitra Babu Door repair - two quotes have been given, one for 6235rs from Rahul or 6435rs from Velu. HB agreed that they are happy with either quote and the work can go ahead.

Terra Amata roof - Roof adjustment/extension. Anbalagham Murugan's bid was Rs. 39,950. HB requested and received assurances that this would be the last time housing has to pay money for this roof, as around 1 lakh has already been spent and the construction is relatively new. These assurances were given that this should be the last time this roof should need repair.

Sven, Djama Roof Repair. Sven had an urgent roof repair, the cost was quoted at Rs. 20,000 and Sven was able to pay for half. The request for 10,000 rs was approved based on the urgent need.

Repairs in Mukti - the lock is being repaired and there is an estimate for the fence being drawn up.

Subramaniam, Prayathna - Subramanian needed to change his toilet from Indian style to Western because he could not manage with it anymore. There is also a new soak pit cover required, for the pit that is shared between his & the NC house. Approved based on the shared nature of the infrastructure and urgency of the new toilet needed.

Nilen, Adventure - Not an emergency and can be patched up until after the monsoon/March time when we will have a better idea of the budget.

Loans and Grants - All Grants are on hold as per BCC's instruction.

Matilde Loan - Matilde requested, and was granted, a 27,000 rs loan for her soak repair.

Housing Development/Youth Housing:

Fraternity Roundhouse Renovation -HB decided to stay with the original agreement with the community and HS of last year, to make it a NC house for a single person. HS to proceed with obtaining quotes for the work.

From the Forest Group re: the disputed HT Line

In an effort towards transparency, clarity, and inclusion, the Forest Group and the Youth Center would like to inform the community on the topic of the HT line through Bliss Forest and the Youth Center.

There have been long pending issues around the proposed roads in the Master Plan (Perspectives 2025) hitting the realities on the ground. Recently, this has come to head in one specific case: the planned laying of the HT line in the area of Bliss Forest / YC. For detailed accounts, please see the documents posted on Tuesday, November 24th 2020 on Auronet <https://auroville.org.in/article/82384> that shed light on the ongoing discussion between the various stakeholders (Forest Group, Youth Center, AV Foundation, Gol Grant Group, WCom, FAMC, TDC, Unity Fund, AVES, Green Group). The documents uploaded to the AVNet are:

- A timeline of the events and communication regarding the HT line since March 2020
- The Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) commissioned by the TDC in order to justify any deviation of the proposed route to the GOI (submitted in July 2020) [02]
- Notes from Forest Group meeting, presentation by TDC, at Aurodam in March 2020 [01]
- Notes from meeting between FAMC, GOI grant group, TDC, Forest Group, Youth Centre, AVES, WC, at Youth Center, November 2nd, 2020 [03]
- A TDC map showing the proposed road layout in the city area, and a map showing the costs of the two options (along the road vs. through YC and the forest) [10] & [06]
- The letter from the Foundation office advising the TDC to mark and clear all Right of Ways (RoWs) on Auroville-owned land by January 2021, and Forest Group's response. [05] & [08]
- A letter of the TDC to the Working Committee (and copied to the Foundation office) insisting on the TDC's planning authority and the right to issue work orders to clear the RoWs. This letter also included a list of a few Aurovilians who are "opposed" to the laying of the cable as per "Master

- Plan", a move we find incompatible with Auroville ideals, as it was clearly meant to intimidate the mentioned persons. Also, it did not reflect the numbers of Aurovilians who signed the petition and those who are members of the Forest Group. [09]

What next? - The Forest Group, Bliss Forest stewards and Youth Centre have written to the TDC to understand how we could move out of this deadlock situation. How The Mother's Inner Quest brought Her to Sri Aurobindo (By Lopa)

Lopa, the former student of the Sri Aurobindo International Centre of Education, has collected stories recounted by the Mother about herself. In this talk, Lopa speaks about the Mother's spiritual experiences from childhood on, her studying occultism in Tlemcen, Algeria and her meeting with Sri Aurobindo on 29th March 1914 in Pondicherry.

As a child the Mother meditated in her chair. She sleepwalked, wrote poems and received spiritual teaching in her dreams. At the age of thirteen in Paris, the Mother went out of her body in the evenings and she was wearing a long golden robe where the suffering people took refuge. And when she was twenty, she created a passage through the vital world, so that when people die, they can go through a protected passage to the Light.

In 1906 and 1907, she traveled to Tlemcen, Algeria and stayed with Max and Alma Theon learning advanced occultism from them. Alma Theon was a powerful medium and with her occult vision she could see the Mother wearing a crown with twelve pearls above her head and said: 'You are That' - Tat.

Around the time when the Mother stayed in Tlemcen, Sri Aurobindo had his own occult experiences. In Baroda, he was practicing pranayama five hours a day and realized that it protected him from mosquitoes. And he became aware that there was an electric current around him, that his body was glowing, and that poetry was flowing easily to him. Then, under the guidance of Yogi Vishnu Bhaskar Lele, he experienced the total silencing of his mind and found that in the silent mind state he was able to continue with his political work for India's Independence. From within the inner voice, the Master of his Yoga, gave him his full program of sadhana, and was guiding him. The first contact between the Mother and Sri Aurobindo came about through the question regarding the spiritual meaning of the hexagram, the ancient symbol in many religions and of Shakti and Shiva. Then in 1914, the Mother was able to come to Pondicherry and meet Sri Aurobindo. When she saw him for the first time, she realized it was the same Krishna she had seen again and again in her dreams. They recognized each other and shared their spiritual and occult experiences. And particularly the knowledge about the Divine spark, the psychic being, which the Mother had received from the Theons, enriched the evolutionary and integral yoga of Mother and Sri Aurobindo. To Look on Nature

"I have learned to look on Nature"

(William Wordsworth, 1770 - 1850)

Nature was the first school of mankind. But it changes of course. If we saw Auroville's landscape about 200 years ago, in the Wordsworth's time, we can see the forest, full of life. But in 1968 this place was semidesert with the deep erosion. His Holiness the Dalai Lama visited Auroville in 1973 and 1993. He said in 1993: "Twenty years ago it was difficult to find a shade here, but now Auroville hasn't this problem."

In the 19th and 20th century the anthropogenic deforestation was in almost all the planet. Auroville's ecosystem is a miracle, we have now a resurrection of Nature. The heroic pioneers of our city with their titanic efforts returned the land to forest, life, school of Nature. It is a remarkable lesson among the ecological crisis on Earth.

There is an invisible nature. For the biologist, ontogenesis repeats philogenesis. It means, individual development suits the evolutionary one. The human foetus is once very similar like fish. In the full history of mankind there was a time where our ancestors lived in the ocean. In that old time the ocean didn't know overfishing and pollution. Now there is a slogan: SOS - save our seas.

The ocean isn't indifferent to its fate (hikmet in Arabian). It is sometimes in the counterattacks - for example to use the tsunamis. In 2004 the tsunami killed many people - thanks the Lord there weren't Aurovilians among them. But in Auroville the ocean destroyed Repos and Waves (previously its name was Wild Waves). Now Aurovilians have a contact with the ocean in Sri Ma mainly. The situation in Quiet isn't really quiet.

If the human population on the earth is growing in the geometrical progression, Nature creates its own limit - the pandemy of virus. Est modus in rebus - there is a measure in the things. This expression belongs to Horacius, Rome's poet. It is true in any time. People became the slaves of industry, machines. But Nature repeats again and again: "I am living and not so weak." It can give more lessons to mankind.

Auroville shows the positive way for humanity: it needs collaboration with nature, not confrontation. Nature awaits from us amicus curiae - friendly care.


Thank You



When in 2017, Om and Julie decided to buy a drone, they didn't imagine how much it was going to change their lives. "Earth from above" by Yann Arthus-Bertrand, with its pictures taken from a helicopter, comes out in 1999, bringing about in photographers the desire to defy gravity. Drones, without matching the capacities of a plane or helicopter, free the photographers by offering them radically novel points of view.



Dronomania has since then invaded the whole world.

And Auroville is no exception. But drone owners who want to get authorisation for filming or taking pictures in Auroville, usually limit themselves to the Matrimandir, in order to make spectacular postcards. What Om and Julie are looking for is much more ambitious. Their aim is to show Auroville like no one has done before.

After the first pictures and the progressive mastering of the camera, they realise their tool's enormous potential and decide to document Auroville in its integrality. Their approach, however, is not in any way documentary but artistic and creative: it is to reveal the landscape's unique beauty, always offered to us in a horizontal way, in a partial manner, because of the forest's omnipresence. The zenithal view reveals, in the midst of the greenery, precious gems like crimped diamonds: the geometry of constructions, clearings, watercourses, a landscape as surprising as a newly discovered planet.

Om and Julie, sky explorers, take hundreds of pictures, undergoing a metamorphosis, becoming full time professional photographers. In 2018, the idea imposes itself: it must be made into a book. The project starts in 2019 with the support of

"We tried organising our work - Om tells us - starting from the Matrimandir, progressively enlarging the operative field, dividing the territory into zones, forests, schools, communities, etc..., then enlarging again, Kuyilapalayam, the farms, the green belt... In fact, following a method is almost impossible because we can't predict anything, everything changes depending on the time, the light, the weather. What we were trying to show was sometimes difficult to achieve, and not always up to our expectations.

On the other hand, there were surprises, places so beautiful, seen from above, that we could only go back to, during seasonal changes for example. A little bit of rain can completely remodel a landscape." The experience acquired over time allows them to interpret certain signs, anticipate perceptions, as if sight was no longer only the prerogative of the eye but of all senses, as if they had the power, in the same way their flying device does, to propel themselves in the air and embrace the horizon from 360 degrees. They learn to conjugate skies and lands, to become fluid and shifting.

After some time, the material is so abundant that it becomes obvious: the book is not enough. That is when they decide to hold an exhibition. "The book and exhibition are indissociable, one is only the extension of the other - says Julie - in fact, the book will be presented on the opening day."

The exhibition is a day, from dawn to dusk, a fragment of astronomical revolution, an inner journey much like the one these two artists when through. Auroville - as promised - like you have never seen it. The infrastructure, roads, sports grounds, edifices and electric lines emerge from the forest like Aztec remains, the architecture, dusty or saturated with the life of an omnivorous nature, the perfection of dawn of time waters and skies, minuscule humans and their shadows cast through the evening's gold.

The pictures are accompanied by quotes from the Mother and Sri Aurobindo, that tell us about what originated Auroville's creation, like a comment that isn't one, but rather a question as if the images themselves were asking: are we living up to the dream? Without answers, without judgment. Just a vision.
