

Satprem: Yes, Sri Aurobindo said that in the supramental consciousness, past, present and future exist side by side on a single map of knowledge. ["For while the reason proceeds from moment to moment of time and loses and acquires and loses and again acquires, the gnosis dominates time in a one view and perpetual power and links past, present and future in their indivisible connections, in a single continuous map of knowledge, side by side. The gnosis starts from the totality which it immediately possesses; it sees parts, groups and details only in relation to the totality and in one vision with it." (The Synthesis of Yoga, XX.464)]

The Mother: Yes, that's it. That's right. But for me it is an experience. Not something I "think" (I don't think), but an experience. And hard to explain.

And its effect on us, the sensation it produces in us depends exclusively on the position of our consciousness. There is the consciousness of being in oneself or being in the whole (being in the whole is already a bit better than being egoistically oneself, and it has its advantages and disadvantages, but it's not the truth), the Truth is... the Divine as totality - totality in time and totality in space. And that consciousness, the body CAN have, because this body had it (momentarily, for a few moments), and while it has it, everything is so... you see, it's not joy, it's not pleasure, it's not happiness, nothing of all that... a sort of blissful peace... and luminous... and creative. Magnificent. Only, it comes and goes, comes and goes.... And when you go out of it, you have the impression of falling into a horrible pit - our ordinary consciousness (I mean the ordinary human consciousness) is a horrible pit. But we also know why it had to be momentarily that way, for it was necessary in order to go from this to that: everything that happens is necessary for the full development of the goal of creation. You could say (we could word-paint): the goal of creation is for the creature to become conscious as the Creator. There you are.

It's word-painting, but it's in that direction. This creation's goal is that Consciousness of the Infinite, the Eternal, which is omnipotent - Infinite, Eternal, Omnipotent (which our religions have called God: for us, with respect to life, it's the Divine) - Infinite and Eternal, All-Powerful... outside of time: each individual particle possessing that Consciousness; each individual particle containing that same Consciousness.

Division created the world, and it is in division that the Eternal manifests.

Words are stupid, but that's how it is. I don't know if you follow. (silence)

With, in addition (and not as a contradiction, but as a complement), the exact sense of what you are supposed to do - what you are supposed to be, what you are supposed to do and why you have been created. And all that **TOGETHER**... Oh!... (Mother has a blissful smile).

That gives both the reason and the goal of creation - both at once - and almost the method of development. (silence)

Yes, it's like something that **IS**, that is as a whole and is successively projected on a screen. And yet it exists as a whole - and it is projected successively on a screen. (Mother goes into contemplation)

I have the impression that I am on the way to discovering... the illusion that must be destroyed so that physical life can be uninterrupted - discovering that death comes from a... a distortion of consciousness. That's it.

It's this close, you know (Mother makes a gesture as if she were about to grasp the secret).

And as I told you, sometimes I feel that the great number of years makes the work somewhat more difficult, but taken on the whole, it is a **GREAT** help - I understood that were I young, I could never have done what I am doing. And when I am in the true consciousness, the moment I am in the true consciousness, the number of years is nothing! - The body feels so young, so full of... something else than young (for it, young is *immature* and ignorant, it's not that), it's... you're in communion with "something" ... which changes according to the need.

Our language (or our consciousness) is... inadequate. Later I'll be able to say. Something IS HAPPENING - that's all I can say. (Mother laughs) Merry Christmas, mon petit!

COVID 19 Updates

All those who are travelling to Auroville from other countries, please read the <u>new guidelines/ SOP for surveillance and response</u> for the <u>new SARS- Cov2- Variant, issued by the Central Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW)</u> issued on 22nd Dec' 2020. All flights arriving from the UK are suspended until 31st December, and all travellers arriving from other countries after visiting UK or transiting through UK airports will be subject to the RT-PCR test on arrival

Furthermore, in view of these guidelines, the district authorities may contact passengers who have arrived in Auroville from the UK between 25th November and 8th December to monitor their health conditions even after the expiry of their quarantine period. And they may also contact all arriving international passengers, especially from the UK, who arrived after 9th December to check on their quarantine conditions. For those who have symptoms a new test could be asked for by the local authorities.

Please note that these guidelines are published by the Central government, and in addition to these other guidelines or ordinances may be issued by the state and/or the district authorities that could change depending on the evolving situation and more restrictions could be added. We will share them as and when issued and are made available to us.

Therefore, we are again requesting that all International arriving travellers please inform the Residents Service and the Covid-19 task force/ Working Committee soon after their arrival in Auroville. Those who have not yet done so are requested to inform us as soon as possible so that we can assist them when approached by district authorities.

For all future travellers who are planning to return to Auroville from abroad the existing rules regarding arrival procedures and mandatory 14-day quarantine protocol remain in place. We will do our best to inform as soon as possible if there are any changes to those.



WORKING GROUP REPORTS

Re: Sri Aurobindo's 150th birth anniversary celebration

As you may be aware, Sri Aurobindo's 150th birth anniversary will happen on August 15, 2022. As Sri Aurobindo is a person of national eminence, this anniversary will be recognized and honored all over India.

We are in the process of forming a task force to plan and prepare celebrations in Auroville. We have discussed if Auroville should request the Government of India for a special grant for this purpose, such as the one given by the HRD Ministry for Auroville's 50th anniversary. However, we propose that the community will celebrate this event independently of any GOI grants, and instead raise donations for the purpose and rely on our own funds. It is not envisioned that this celebration will be on the same scale or with the same approach as the 50th events.

FAMC Weekly Bulletin:

Monday 7 December 2020 to Sunday 13 December 2020

In addition to our regular correspondence and meetings (such as with Working Groups and residents);

- Kalpana: After further review and discussion the FAMC decided that Stewardship Agreements for the Kalpana Housing Project should be commenced from this week. The Housing Board and Housing Service were duly informed. Communication continued with the Project Holders regarding Kalpana Housing Project.
- FAMC met with Working Committee members and the TDC to start discussing the future of Tamarind Tope (and how it can be meaningfully developed for Auroville). Also discussed was New Creation Boarding. Issues affecting its current status and management mean that it cannot be allowed to remain as it is. Subsequent work on how to move those discussions forward began.
- FAMC met and consulted with other working groups (Auroville Council, Land Board, and Working Committee) to discuss how to develop more coordinated strategies for dealing with problems that cut across the mandates of working groups involving individuals that form the interest of the separate working groups for different reasons.
- Work continued in relation to Roma's Kitchen and in particular on how to settle and define liabilities and assets that will form the basis of an MoU with the selected executives, Gumsoon and Thulasingam. In particular, a site visit to Roma's Kitchen has revealed an asset in need of urgent maintenance.
- FAMC continued its correspondence with Auroville Arts Service regarding its scope of work and approach to contributions owed to City Services. Specifically, the AV Arts Service is attempting to include an unlimited scope of work that exceeds any normal understanding of art. This combined with its refusal to contribute to City Services as per the Code of Conduct would establish it as a broad based contribution evasion umbrella that could deeply diminish the income of City Services. This is a long-standing issue and all concerned should understand the need to move forward. [Response to this item from Auroville Arts appears after this report Eds.]
- FAMC reviewed its responsibilities under its mandate and the skills needed to execute them to help better define them for future members. The results were shared with the RAS.

Units and Trusts (to be added) 10/11/2020:

- The FAMC approved the Renewal of INSIDE Trust, Trustees reappointment (Mr. Hubertus G. Peter, Mr. Klaus Onken)
- The FAMC approved Auro Agilam an activity under AFA (Auroville Food Activities), Banumathi is appointed as manager
- The FAMC approved Nutchease an activity under AFA (Auroville Food Activities), Debdatta is appointed as manager

AVArtS statement on FAMC meeting notes

We, at AVArtS, define ourselves as a platform for art AND CULTURE in Auroville. The scope of our work is Service work, and is not limited to the administration of a cooperative of activities registered with us. We are searching to establish the international emphasis that the Mother gave to Auroville as the home for the best of the culture and spirit of all nations.

An interesting non-Eurocentric global study of what art and culture encompass is beautifully graphically displayed by the UNESCO chart (https://unstats.un.org/unsd/statcom/doc10/BG-FCS-E.pdf, figure 2, pg 24 'framework for cultural statistics domains'), which may help to understand where we are coming from. Other references can be found within the Indian traditions (list of 64 arts) and the Asian traditions. Whilst engaging in this large non-Eurocentric approach to art AND CULTURE, we would like to say that we offer this 'definition' only to say that we can help Auroville by registering small activities in these areas, if required by the Aurovilians working in these sectors, and if required by whatever group may be in charge of authorizing the

activity registrations. Meanwhile, we continue to offer our Services to this large sector of art AND CULTURE.

Regarding contributions by the activities registered with us, we are requesting the FAMC to give our activity managers a reprieve from the 5% mandatory contribution to City Service on turnover and asking that the activity managers can make a choice of how much to contribute to the CS according to their individual financial situation. We have explained that there needs to be an openness to the financial status of the activity managers, since, nowadays, many activity managers do not receive a maintenance and some have no other means of financial sustenance. Commercial units write off their maintenances as well as many expenses before making CS contributions and activity managers are, rather unfairly, left to fend for themselves. Flat rates on turnover do not work for many activities in the art and culture sector and we have explained these reasons to the FAMC.

To put the "broad based contribution evasion that could deeply diminish the income of City Services" in perspective:

2019-2020 consolidated figures of Auroville contributions made by all activity managers registered with AVArtS:

- CS contribution of about 1.5 lakhs instead of about 3.3 lakhs that would have been expected as 5% of turnover. (A deep diminishment of 1.8 lakhs.)
- Cash donations to Land for Auroville: about 18 lakhs
- In-kind contributions to the City of Auroville by our activity managers listed below:
 - 20 Free Performances
 - > 4 Free public art installations
 - > 34 Free exhibitions
 - > 32 Free workshops (1-4 days long)
 - 7 Free courses (10 days 3 months long)
 - > 3 Public art events (7-10 days long)
 - > 524 Free 2 hr classes
 - > 20 Free 1.5 hr classes
 - > 160 Free 1 hr classes
 - > 10 Free participation in fund-raising events
 - 41 Free participation in events that were free for Aurovilians
 - > 400 Free art studio sharings
 - 500 copies of a free art/culture magazine, including working/writing/designing free for it
 - 20 Free art work for Art For Land
 - 19 Free films for AV projects/services
 - 4000 Free photographs for AV projects/units/services (approx. no)

All the above contributions have been shared with the FAMC and have yet to be acknowledged by them as a valid contribution to the life, economy, society and community of Auroville.

The activity managers registered with AVArtS indeed display generosity, a sense of responsibility towards Auroville, and a will to contribute liberally in spite of limited financial income. Our request is that this is recognised with a waiver of the 5% contribution to CS on turnover and replaced with an acknowledgment that all the activity managers may contribute according their means.

Monday 14 December 2020 to Sunday 20 December 2020

In addition to our regular correspondence and meetings (such as with Working Groups and residents);

- We are keenly aware of the issues some individuals (Aurovilians and Friends of Auroville) are facing with trying to get refunds of donations made in particular towards their housing needs. We met with one such individual this week and discussed possible ways to obtain further clarity (and some finality) on how we should approach this issue (and attendant issues concerning FCRA that it raises).
- Recurring issues we are dealing with, concern the best way
 to encourage work continuity and succession planning by
 Units and Trusts, particularly given the aging trustee pool
 that we have in Auroville. We wrote, again, to one such
 Trust (Auromitra) and asked that further consideration be
 given to these issues.

- A regular facet of our work concerns the handling and assessment of new entity applications. To give greater clarity regarding this work we posted (on 15 Dec) a short note from our Applications Review Group (ARG) regarding the process that new applicants go through to get their units and activities (hopefully) to the stage of their applications being approved by the FAMC
- The members met on Friday with the Auroville Council and Aurovilians the Council has selected to review the FAMC mandate. Discussions commenced regarding the process for reviewing the FAMC mandate. It is expected that this exercise will result in two different versions that the community can select from in an RAD.

The aim of the regular monthly ABS meetings is to hear and address the concerns and needs of our services, and to build together a flourishing Services and Prosperity economy for Auroville, as envisioned by the Mother. The first monthly ABS meeting took place on Monday 14 December 2020 at the Unity Pavilion, and was attended by 50 services members in good spirit. Meeting notes are available and were sent to all the services by email.

It was warmly suggested in the first meeting, that each time 2 services could present themselves shortly at the beginning of the monthly meetings. So this time, the theme will be "Services for food security in Auroville", with FOODLINK and FARM GROUP to kick start the opening presentation series.

Some of the topics to be included in the main part of this coming ABS meeting are:

- Selection of your new Services representative for the BCC, as Jacques resigned end of October
- Collective update of the mission statement of ABS
- What IS a service in the Auroville context?
- Budgets and documenting the services situation on the ground
- How can the services participate to have an active and alive ABS?

We take this opportunity to thank Isha for the ABS coordination work done over the past years as she has recently stepped down as the main coordinator. We would also like to inform you of the new ABS desk in Town Hall, first floor - shared with ABC for a closer collaboration - with Rama as your ABS administrative member in the afternoons. From AVST: Pour Tous Purchasing Service update #4

The last time you heard from us was on 14th November [https://auroville.org.in/article/82237], we shared with you the latest developments towards implementation of the Residents Assembly Decision (RAD) for Pour Tous Purchasing Service (PTPS) to be a service for the community.

Over the last month, in close collaboration with the Transition Team, we have, 1) finalized the work plan or "What do we mean by a service?" [https://auroville.org.in/article/82839], 2) finalized the process to invite skilled & capable Aurovilians to a new executive team [https://auroville.org.in/article/82839]. This is an announcement and information at this time only. The invitation to serve on the new executive team will be made by the Residents Assembly Service (RAS) in mid-January and; 3) finalized the recommendation for maximum margin on all products. This has been done after an analysis of income & expenses in 2019-2020 was conducted. We recommend a maximum margin on all products is 11%, with the intended implementation date of 1st January 2021. The current PTPS team is in agreement with this recommendation. Two additional points are: 1) it is a temporary measure until a more detailed analysis will be conducted and; 2) it's a recommended margin, with the objective of reducing the prices immediately.

The Trust accountant has finalized the audit recently and we expect the report in the next few days.

We have reworked the Management Board paper proposed by the FAMC. The FAMC proposed draft, in our view, sought to move some Trust responsibilities to the Board. In our revision, we feel the role of the Group respective to the Trust is now clear. We have prepared the document 'PTPS Management / Advisory Group' [https://auroville.org.in/article/82839] to be implemented after the new executive team is in place.

The work over the next month will focus on initiating, in collaboration with the Residents Assembly Service, and completing the process to create the new executive team. Be on the lookout for the RAS invitation to all Aurovilians with particular skills and capacities to offer to serve in a new four-person executive team. We hope that you'll participate with an open heart and sincerity in this part of the transformation process. The transition continues to be a field of learning and growing for all of us who are directly involved and we're thankful for this opportunity to serve the community in this way.

BCC Review of Pour Tous Water (PTW)

In October 2014 Residents' Assembly decided to constitute the Pour Tous Water (PTW), a free service, as follows:

"The work and objectives of PTW is to be essentially an Emergency - Repair & Maintenance Public Service: 24/7 emergency availability. We are available for emergency situations: pipe broke/ Sludge crisis/ pump problem/ water delivery / Fire/ other natural damages. PTW is not available for new construction for or City water pipe supply and connection".

In this RA decision the BCC was asked to review the activity of PTW. In September 2020 the PTW team requested the BCC to help with the administration and accounting of the service, because of disagreements between the two signatories, Grace and Shanmugam. Since October 2020 the BCC has started looking into the PTW administration and activities and is handling the PTW accounts and releasing payments. During the last 4 months the BCC has realised that:

- PTW service is not yet statutory registered as a service unit under an Auroville trust
- Due to the lack of this statutory registration of the service the seven employees were not registered
- Some practices related to payments and loans are to be improved
- The present disharmony between PTW team members is affecting the functioning of the service.

After thorough discussion together with PTW team and reflections on the possible next steps, the BCC recommends: $\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1$

• To register the service with accountable executives under an Auroville trust, this is a priority.

- To suspend the PTW service until the registration process is completed.
- · To pay the settlement of the current employees.
- The registered service will constitute and register the working team.
- That the BCC continue to support and supervise PTW's administration up to the end of the current financial year (March 2021).
- That the existing team reach out for help to solve their internal conflicts.

It is understood that during this temporary suspension PTW will complete pending works but won't be available to take up new tasks. During this time, the Housing repair team is willing to take up emergencies. If you have any emergency, please contact the Housing Service.

The BCC will try its best to speed up the registration of the service and keep this suspension as short as possible. The maintenances of the Aurovilians will go on. The BCC believes that PTW provides an important service to the community and would like to express its appreciation to all the Aurovilians who were and/or are still part of PTW team.

HR Initiative is a service which helps individual Aurovilians and Newcomers who are looking for suitable work to find it, and to help Auroville units and services who are looking to fill positions to find the right individuals to step in.

- Over 130 candidates registered
- 33 units and 4 services posted jobs via HRi
- 91 interviews
- 26 placements
- online platform for candidates to make a free multimedia CV

We are very happy to announce that our HR Initiative is showing solid results for work transparency in Auroville, even and especially in the trying times we live in.

Started in March 2019, we now have a (much more) clear overview of who is looking for work in Auroville and where work opportunities can be found.

Our way of keeping a profile confidential for both candidate and unit or service really seems to help in opening up opportunities for Aurovilians and Newcomers.

Our weekly announcement with available jobs has helped to attract more units and well as convinced candidates to fill in our form, come meet us to talk about their aspirations and even make a free online profile to share anywhere they desire.

Other activities we facilitate:

- 2 succession projects trying to find new dynamic leaders for units.
- assistance and advice towards becoming independent yet compliant and transparent contributors to the AV economy instead of relying on maintenance only.
- specific focus on getting the AV youth online (via online platform) and connected with the working world
- supporting peer to peer learning initiatives

Interested? Come join us! We need help in our administration and support from the community to become even better.

Why we fundraise for land for Auroville

Today, 10% of City Area land and over 50% of Greenbelt land
are still missing from the Master Plan area

Land for Auroville was first purchased with the active encouragement of The Mother. She told pioneering Aurovilians "The most important thing is to get the land now."

When Auroville became a legal entity in the 80's, the Government of India began supporting Auroville financially in many ways funds for the research in education (SAIIER) and housing projects (Humanscapes) are the most obvious examples. But it is not be expected that the Indian government gives funds for land purchase.

Many Aurovilians have given funds for purchasing land for Auroville, often investing their last personal resources. They have been backed up by loyal friends in India and around the world, and in particular, by the AVI - Auroville International Associations. In 2003, Aurovilians launched the "1 Million Dollar campaign" for the land - a great success, though it seemed impossible! In the past 7 years, the two campaigns "Acres for Auroville" and "GreenAcres" led by LFAU are today's dynamic actions for raising awareness and funds for Auroville's designated but still-missing plots. Encouraging support from within Auroville and the worldwide Auroville "Family" have enabled the purchase of over 70 new acres of Auroville land, enabling needed new youth housing, farmland, and coherent infrastructure.



Why is fundraising for land a priority for Auroville?

Today Auroville is no longer on an isolated, quiet plateau but finds itself in rapidly developing suburban area of Pondicherry. Now is the time to consolidate strategic land holdings to enable for Auroville's development. Only with consolidating its land, will Auroville be able to become a unified township, and safeguard water resources, forests, organic farming and biodiversity for Auroville and for the wider bioregion.

An Aurovilian's name is entered into the RoR after he/she has met with the Secretary of the AVF with an appointment arranged by the Entry Secretariat. These appointments are fixed by the Entry Secretariat according to the availability of the Secretary, but not at any personal request of an individual.
- The Auroville Foundation processes issuing of ID cards only to the Aurovilians who are registered in the RoR.

YOUNG NATURALISTS PART IV

Today we introduce Tzur (or Grong as he likes to be called), who at 11 years of age divides his time between Grace where his parents live and Fertile where Johnny lives and where he built a house for himself and his friend Sijmen (aka "Pai") in the forest. When in Fertile he likes to help out with cutting dead trees, clearing paths and planting. He also enjoys watching wildlife - mainly birds, but also civet cats



Tzur just joined a group of Aurovilians on a tour across social change initiatives in Tamil Nadu called the Vikalp Yatra. There he saw first-hand people outside are Auroville equally passionate about reforestation and watershed management. In fact, in one of the places he visited near Dharmapuri, people had managed to bring back to life an entire river! When asked how that's possible he explained "because the trees on the hill hold the water like a sponge". He saw a different approach to planting

than we are used to in Auroville: "they collect seeds from bird shit."

and porcupines ("I only saw it once though").

In the Nilgiri mountains he saw the difference between man-made and natural forests. "The man-made ones have only one type of tree, and much less wildlife. In the natural one we saw lots of deer, elephants and birds like the Malabar Grey Hornbill and the Brown headed Barnett. There are also leopards and tigers and vultures but we didn't see them."

Before going on the trip Tzur proposed to do activities with kids in schools, like finding out about local birds and making stencils to print pictures of them on T-shirts. Unfortunately the schools were closed due to Covid, so instead he focused on making tea for everyone (another skill learned at Fertile). Grong and Pai quickly gained a reputation as "tea masters".

****BROADCASTINGS - 2020 and onwards****

We have been reporting on global, bioregional and local environmental issues throughout this tumultuous year, overshadowed as it was by the Covid pandemic, and above this the threat of serious climate change: they had a compounding effect on the quality of life loss of work, health and our mental states and upset the foundation of our very existence.

Climate Change is Anthropogenic (human driven) with our continuous greenhouse gas emissions in the atmosphere causing a 10 °C temperature rise in the Arctic and the Black summer in Australia, Indonesia, the Amazon and the US with apocalyptic forest fires. The changing weather patterns are driven by a complex mix of warming ocean temperatures and atmospheric phenomena, fuelling hurricanes and cyclones, causing devastating damage to life and property in coasts in Asia, America, the Caribbean and even East Africa. Flora and Fauna are going extinct on a scale never seen before. We see melting and retreating glaciers from Iceland, Greenland and the Arctic to the Antarctic and closer to home in the Himalayas. Glacier lakes are filling up, overflowing, damaging settlements downstream, causing floods of biblical proportions. Glaciers are our lifelines, the water resources for India, Nepal, Bangladesh and Pakistan on which over 1 Billion people depend... India alone counted loss of lives and \$ 10 Million in damages.

We have been reporting on all these in the Green Column, noting how interconnected all life on the planet is and how vulnerable our societies are to even 1.5 degrees C of temperature rise (over pre-industrial values). The end of a year is a good time to reflect: how can we learn to live with these changes in 2021 and the decade to come? Which actions can we take; all governments in tandem globally, and we, ourselves in our daily lives? The Covid isolation has taught us to look around ourselves more carefully, and in gratitude, noticing the natural wealth that surrounds us, seeing how we can make do with what is given to us with awareness, compassion and understanding for people which have so much less, separated from loved ones, living in war zones, displaced in refugee camps, or lost as migrants at sea..

Preparation is on for the Climate Conference in Glasgow Scotland at the end of 2021: a make or break event, a chance to turn words into action if we want to come to grips with the Climate Crisis...

We wish all our readers the best for 2021 let us hope it is a year where all the climate- and humanitarian crises get a little more untangled: a year with hope and gratitude for a world that slowly starts to recover from all that has been visited upon it. The Age of Aquarius?

Savitri as the Veda of the Future

In this talk delivered on 26 December 2020, Dr Alok Pandey draws interesting parallels between the Vedas and Sri Aurobindo's Savitri.

In the Vedas, there is a goal that Heaven and Earth ultimately become one. There has always been a struggle between the powers of darkness and light. In their hymns, Vedic Rishis described the sacrifice to the higher, the true, the right and the good.

With the help of his yogic powers, Sri Aurobindo traveled through all the planes of the world traversing its entire existence including its darkest corners. He found and revealed the light in darkness and wrote what kind of transformative work was needed for the widening of human consciousness, development of love and attainment of the knowledge of Oneness.

A mutual debt binds man to the Supreme: His nature we must put on as he put ours; We are sons of God and must be even as he: His human portion, we must grow divine. Our life is a paradox with God for key. (Savitri, p.67)

The Mother also mentioned that: "Savitri is a Mantra for the transformation of the world".

Reflections on Elder-ing

The fact that Auroville has many elderly people is voiced by many, and is true percentage-wise. We certainly do need to keep a balance of age, but the need for more youth should not denigrate those of us who have been around for years. The fact that we have been here for awhile, learned, and given service has gratefully enriched our insights and abilities and made us more useful to the community rather than a burden.

In Lockdown, I have had a very rich time of learning with a student who has been insatiable. When we came to the end of the teaching mode, we explored together, each learning and teaching the other. This learning through expression and creativity broadens and deepens and can raise consciousness for student and teacher at any age. We are all getting older but our attitude toward that process has a great deal to do with how active and well we stay. I was surprised and grateful to find how most Indians treat us with respect and caring in our seventies and eighties.

As we have to slow down many personal issues become clear. Interaction has become important as isolation looms. That may be obvious, but from a very active life with many choices of activity, the opposite can be daunting and surrender more difficult, not easier. As we all know, when we come here we are asked to deal with those parts of ourselves that have been avoided. That does not stop with age. May we all grow with wonder.

Young World

"When all the world is young and all the trees are green..."
(Charles Kingsley: "The Water Babies", November 1863)

I saw a peacock near Marika Home almost without its splendid tail. It was the time for the bird to change its feathers. This process is very natural. Evidently the peahens of its harem don't pay attention to the peacock's beauty in November.

Another autumn bird with remarkable tail appears in Auroville. It is the male Paradise Flycatcher. I never saw this bird changing its feathers. Every creature in our city has its own kind of life. The plants too, they live by different modes. For example, a Banyan is always green, but the Peepal sometimes loses its leaves. The Nature has a long evolution, but it is new, young in every moment. Sometimes the whole environment is changing. Jean in "Two

Banyans" told me that about in 1973 Auroville had not many trees, but a strong cyclone made them naked.

In average the age of Aurovilians changed during half of century. The pioneers of the city were mainly young. After some time the share of Aurovilians in second and third age was growing. But in comparison with the old cities (for example Rome) the dwellers of Auroville are more young.

The Greek word entropy has many meanings. According to one of them the sunrays reflect from deserted landscapes, the Earth loses of these rays. But the green environment of contemporary Auroville catches the sunny beams and transforms them in oxygen, biomass, fertility of soil. There were deep canyons in the place of Auroville; after the strong rains the red soil moved to the ocean. But the plants stopped step by step this erosion.

Sometimes it seemed that Auroville is a city of utopia, its dwellers are idealistic ones and they haven't a practical future. I arrived in Auroville almost thirty years ago, in 1991. Then I saw a child in every Aurovilian. And now my vision isn't changed. It is a city of very young people who created their own young world. This reality has a great perspective. The physical and spiritual atmosphere of the city creates the constant youth of Aurovilians. In both hemispheres of our planet the air is polluted. Buenos Aires means good air but really now it is not for the healthy breathing. Auroville is like a healthy island where children, adults and all living creatures can use the clean air. A lot of green trees in the city produce the new and again new portions of the elixir of life oxygen.

Claire Iono, Aurovilian artist, has been living and working in Auroville for the past 10 years. Her abstract paintings are a true expression of her own personal adventure to fulfil the profound spiritual longing that is at the core of her artistic research. She intuitively fluctuates between the abstract and the figurative, creating subtle worlds that evoke imaginary and symbolic landscapes, where nature is animated. In her visual storytelling there are no boundaries between realms, instead they simply unfold into each other in a kind of continuum.

Hidden cities was born from Claire's aspiration to integrate her past, present and future artistic explorations and practices. "Hidden cities" refers to what cannot be seen within us that emerges; it is also a nod to the lost mythical cities.

The symbolic and allegorical cityscapes, timeless and unknown, may sometimes evoke metropolises or some undiscovered cities.

"The cities are a metaphor of our limitations and resistances", says Claire, "and that's actually the parallel I make, it's between walls and limitations, they form layers of all that must transform in us. The journey to experience this inner transformation is not a linear ascending process but rather a multi-dimensional one"; and this is how Claire etches out her visual narrative, playing with different planes.

Her iridescent paintings are always alight with a fire which is the manifestation of the will that allows us to overcome limitations. "These tormented skies may sometimes seem dramatic but actually they always relate to something beautiful, something that wants to transform, it is where all the possibilities lie. The skies represent these possibilities", she explains, "and on Earth, there is a sea or a river, a flow, that allows us to link everything.

For Claire, words and images go hand in hand and it's from this prose that sounds like a prayer, that this series started tow years ago:


May these cities we build inside ourselves become those tiny silhouettes far away, May these walls disappear, and the New World will come.

Claire Iono's evocative and imaginary is effortlessly fused to create an image of hope and life, with this positive energy that radiates through the beautifully ethereal world that manifests in her work

This year, Claire was a finalist of the national competition Ora Mojarto and of the international exhibition, Art revolution Taipei in Taiwan; she has joined the artists catalogue of Kalakriti Art Gallery, one major gallery in India. Hidden Cities is her third solo show in Auroville.


