




He whom we saw yesterday is on earth...

... "It matters little that there are thousands of beings plunged in the densest ignorance, He whom we saw yesterday is on earth; his presence is enough to prove that a day will come when darkness shall be transformed into light, and Thy reign shall be indeed established upon earth." ...

HOUSE OF MOTHER'S AGENDA



(continued from last week)

18 April 1970

The Mother: But I had the clear knowledge that what I was conscious of last night is something taking place all the time, but I am not aware of it because... so as not to increase the burden of consciousness. Right now, from an ordinary standpoint, for an ordinary human being, the number of things that are conscious at the same time [in Mother] is something tremendous!... And it's without fatigue, effort, difficulty, it's NATURAL, but many more get done consciously and without being relayed to the center of consciousness so... so it doesn't get too much!

There is also this well-known thing: according to the concentration of the consciousness, the value of time changes. That's perpetual and constant. The same circumstances, the same everyday little events I am made to feel with the ordinary consciousness, and then three or four different consciousnesses - and their value changes. It goes from a long, interminable time to... a second. Which means a demonstration of the unreality of time as we perceive it here - that's every day, all the time.

There is a Force acting... At least I think, I feel it's the Force, because it acts through the will (but it's deeper or truer or higher or whatever than the will). For instance, if I am not "supposed" to say something, instead of its going through the thought, "Mustn't speak, you mustn't speak" - I just can't speak anymore!... All sorts of things like that. The functioning is direct. And the body is taught to learn... how it should be. The way it eats has completely changed. For speaking too, it's the same, completely changed.

At times, the body feels such a great strength that it gets the feeling it could do... (it feels, it clearly sees, the hands are strong), a strength of a different quality, but much greater than before. And at other times, it can't even hold itself upright, and for a reason which isn't... It no longer obeys the same laws as those that keep us upright. So... And all that takes place in a single day!... (silence) Ah! (Turning to Sujata) Ask your question.

Sujata: Mother, is there a "Mother of Ignorance"? The Mother: What do you call a Mother of Ignorance? Sujata: I had a dream in which I seemed to meet someone who was the Mother of Ignorance.

The Mother: Possibly.... It's possible, oh yes. Mon petit, EVERYTHING is possible, and not only possible: everything is.

But everything isn't on earth, of course. You understand, there are many worlds, many regions - there is nothing that is impossible and that isn't: if a thing is possible, it means it exists somewhere. Logically, there has to be a Mother of Ignorance.

Satprem to Sujata: What did the Mother of Ignorance do? Sujata: In my dream?... I had a long dream, and towards the end, I met her. I had to go through a place, and I told her, "I must go to the Light, to the Mother of Light." Satprem: And then? Sujata: Then the dream vanished. (Mother did not hear). The Mother: You met her, she spoke to you? Sujata: Yes, Mother, she spoke to me. The Mother: So what did you tell

her? Satprem: She told her she wanted to go to the Mother of Light. The Mother: Oh, (laughing) and then she left! Sujata: But she was there as if... The Mother: She were governing. Sujata: Yes, Mother, as if she were governing. The Mother:

That's right. What are those regions?... There are any number of regions. There are unimaginable things. But where is that? I don't know. Satprem to Sujata: Tell your dream. (Mother continues)

The Mother: It must be a region intermediary between the most material physical, vital and mind. There's everything imaginable, you can see the most extraordinary things. And that's how it is. Strangely, even, you have a power there: one drop of truth has a tremendous power in those worlds. With a single movement you can change lots of things. Only, of course, you also create them in the same way: the contrary movement, the movement of ignorance (all the movements of ignorance in the world) create things all the time. That is to say, it means shaping things, or making them active, or having them act.... Only, it's a reality which... which is impermanent, to begin with. Ultimately, very few forms - forms or thoughts - have an eternal reality: all that (Mother makes a gesture of perpetual recasting) is constantly moving and changing.

I remember the first time (that was very long ago, more than... sixty years ago), the first time I asked, "But why do we die? Why do we live to die? - That's idiotic!" Then I was made to understand that all that we see as "forms" is... (same gesture in perpetual movement). It's our... clenched little consciousness; a clenched consciousness which makes it all appear a "momentous" phenomenon: we are small, we grow big, and in the end, we dissolve. But everything is like that (same gesture), everything is like that! There are very few things - very few - that are eternal. They have a different quality. It's the first experience you get when you contact that which is eternal: it has a different vibratory quality... And then, that will to make this last (Mother points to her body), this which is made, entirely made of wrong movements - wrong movements and constantly in movement, constantly changing, constantly (same gesture)... As Sri Aurobindo said, "You want to make your body and everything around it last as it is?" - No, thank you! (Mother laughs) To last is, in fact, to become conscious, fully conscious in the eternal world. (silence) He knew all that, Sri Aurobindo.... Have you seen the latest Aphorisms? Satprem: On laughter? (Satprem reads) 478 - A God who cannot smile could not have created this humorous universe. (Mother laughs) 476 - When will the world change into the model of heaven? When all mankind becomes boys and girls together with God revealed as Krishna and Kali, the happiest boy and strongest girl of the crowd, playing together in the gardens of Paradise.

The Semitic Eden was well enough, but Adam and Eve were too grown up and its God himself too old and stern and solemn... The Mother: Oh!... (Mother laughs) Satprem: ...for the offer of the Serpent to be resisted.

The Mother: Truly admirable! (silence) (Turning to Sujata) So next time, if you see her, just tell her, "Your time will soon be past." Sujata: I simply told her, "O Mother of Ignorance, it is to the Mother of Light that I want to go."

The Mother: And it was enough! (Mother laughs)

Covid Updates

After the recent positive cases in Auroville (both symptomatic) and our request to cancel or postpone events, we have received a number of communications asking for clarifications about this.

Events and programs may continue at this time. However, being conscious of the rising number of COVID cases in and around Auroville, as well as in the country, please abide by the following:

- The **number of people** at any event must be no more than 50% of the venue capacity and not more than 600, according to current Tamil Nadu State guidelines.
- The **organizers are responsible** for ensuring that masks are worn, physical distance maintained, hand sanitizer or hand washing facilities are available and used often, and a log of participants is kept.
- If the event is open to the **non-Auroville public** the Working Committee must be informed at least one week in advance so the relevant authorities are informed.

Please be aware that the State Government has issued a new press release (see [here](#) in Tamil and English) after having carried out a review of the current situation in the state.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who, in spite of the inconvenience caused, chose to respect the call to cancel or postpone planned events or gatherings in order to allow time for the contact tracing to happen and to minimize the risk of further spread of the virus. In the event that there are any new positive cases in Auroville we will inform the community.

Important Notice from the Financial Service!

From April 1, 2021, **cheque books and passbooks of over half a dozen banks** which went through a merger will become **invalid**. This will also affect IFSC (branch code) and maybe even account numbers. The banks affected by these changes are **Dena Bank, Vijaya Bank, Corporation Bank, Andhra Bank, Oriental Bank of Commerce, United Bank and Allahabad Bank**. In case any Auroville employees have accounts with the above-mentioned banks, it is important for us to have correct account details (like account number and IFSC), in order to transfer salaries. - submitted by the Financial Service Team

GENERAL MEETING ON HT LINE THROUGH BLISS AREA AND THE YOUTH CENTER (RESCHEDULED)

Saturday, March 27, 2021, 4pm - 6pm, Unity Pavilion

As most community members are aware, there has been an ongoing issue with the laying of the HT line through the Bliss area and the Youth Centre. In order to find a solution to lay this cable, Forest Group and the Youth Centre have decided to call a General Meeting on the subject. The purpose of the meeting is to share with the community the process which has been followed so far and the viewpoint of the Forest Group and Youth Centre. In order to lay the cable with the least impact to the environment and the YC, we propose to follow an alternate route, detailed in an EIA (environmental impact assessment) carried out at the request of the TDC.

The agenda of the General Meeting is as follows:

- **Welcome and introduction**
 - **Process & communication timeline**
 - **The Forest Group and management of forested areas in Auroville**

- **The EIA (Environmental Impact Assessment)**
 - **The Youth Centre and Youth in Auroville**
 - **The Galaxy Concept and the Master Plan**
- 5 - 5.10 PM Tea break
- 5.10 - 5.20 PM Concluding presentation placing the HT cable issue in the wider context of the purpose of Auroville
- 5.20 - 6 PM - Q and A, and discussion
- 6- 8 PM Optional soup dinner for additional informal interaction

Due to Covid restrictions the number of people allowed inside Unity Pavilion will be limited to 100. Additional 100+ people can follow the GM transmitted to several speakers spread out in the outdoor spaces of Unity Pavilion. The meeting will also be streamed live via Zoom (link will be provided through mass mailer). As we understand that the interactive session from 5.20pm - 6.00pm might not be sufficient to have all questions answered and all voices heard, we organise a few additional options for the community to follow-up:

Right after the GM (6pm - 8pm) there will be a soup dinner served at Unity Pavilion to allow for additional informal interaction

The GM+ platform of the RAS will be used for sharing presentation material of the GM, the video recording of the meeting and related media online and allow for further discussion.

A follow-up event will be organised for Saturday, April 3rd, 2pm - 6pm at the Youth Centre. Stalls for each presentation made during the GM will allow for further information sharing and discussion. Of course everybody is invited to take a walk in the area and see the ground realities firsthand.

The General Meeting on Saturday is an information sharing by the Forest Group and Youth Centre. We intend this meeting to be in preparation for a GM, however, as the RAS announced on February 24th, any decision-making events (RAD) are put on hold for the time being, so there is no set date for this RAD. We hope the next steps could be a GM by the TDC to present their view and maybe a third where all groups (TDC, FG, YC) present together, depending on how the process matures.

'Hi' from the Funds and Assets Management Committee

A first hello and update from the new FAMC team!

First and foremost, thank you for placing your trust in us to carry this work forward. After an orientation for the 6 new members with the three ongoing, as well as three former members, our team is busy going through the 13 page current agenda, familiarising ourselves with the pending tasks at hand and the required time input in terms of complexity, information, and overlaps with other groups. At the end of the March we're studying the work plan set up by the previous members of the FAMC and plan a facilitated session to create the next phase of it.

At the same time, we're forming new liaisons with the various working groups, both as a whole team and in smaller groups. Right now there is a focus on **land related issues**.

The Working Committee together with the FAMC are meeting weekly with the Land Board, to provide a time slot only dedicated to these matters. The other focus is the interaction with the BCC, and taking up the pending appeals. Certain pressing matters need to be handled straight away such as the ongoing Income Tax matter.

The new FAMC team is busy with its envisioning program, and figuring out a process which will allow for more transparency, openness and collaboration with resource people or forming support groups for certain issues. Following the resignations of Christine, Jacques and Meena, there are now three positions in the Budget Coordination Committee (BCC) which need to be filled. As mentioned in the BCC mandate, general criteria for being a BCC member are:

- A. Proven commitment to the realization of a collective organization and economy as envisaged by the Mother for Auroville.
- B. A capacity to see beyond the particular needs of their own representative area of work or interest.
- C. An openness and concern for the well being of all aspects of Auroville's maintenance and development.
- D. A capacity to work in a team and to give sufficient time to the work, in a spirit of goodwill, collaboration and transparency.
- E. An affinity and / or experience with community work in the domain of budgeting and accounting.
- F. An in-depth knowledge in any of the areas represented in the BCC.

In addition to the above, the BCC is looking for someone with experience and knowledge of the Service sector, particularly the so-called 'Prosperity' services (PTDC, Farms etc.), to join the committee as this is one area which needs to be strengthened.

Also specially needed are persons who are good with "numbers", finance and accounting concepts, and working with Excel/ spreadsheets. Skill in in-person communication and facility with the Tamil language would also be valued.

Call for Grant Proposals - SDZ Funding in 2021

The Project Coordination Group (PCG) will be meeting soon to review grant proposals for possible funding by Stichting De Zaaier. **The last date for submitting proposals for this call is Monday, 26th April 2021.** You are welcome to submit earlier or send us a draft version of your proposal for comment prior to the due date. (If you plan to submit a proposal, please carefully read this full announcement to the end!) All documents related to this purpose are to be submitted in the prescribed forms as attachments, emailed to pcg@auroville.org.in. Please note that in case your proposal is not ready by this date, another call for proposals for SDZ will be announced later this year.

Only those initiatives that can be carried out under prevailing COVID conditions will be considered. The Project Coordination Group will check whether proposals fall within the SDZ funding criteria and forward those that do to the SDZ Board for final selection and grant allocation.

Stichting de Zaaier welcomes project proposals for:

- research studies in the fields of sociology, economy, psychology and inner development;
- exploratory (research) studies into the relations with the world outside Auroville, in particular with the villages (and villagers) surrounding Auroville, as well as proposals for initiatives that seek to contribute to strengthening these relations;
- initiatives that seek to enhance the efficient co-operation of Aurovilians with the aim of making full use of the existing potential in Auroville;
- studies exploring a sustainable future for Auroville and initiatives contributing to such a future;
- initiatives requiring seed money (micro-projects) for innovative and informal education and training, women's development, outreach as well as proposals prepared by youth.

Please note that funds are generally not available for infrastructure, buildings or transport. Requests for equipment will only be considered if specifically required for the implementation of the project and are not already available in Auroville. Stichting De Zaaier has also indicated a preference for funding projects where the maintenance of Aurovilians is

either provided by Auroville or from a source other than SDZ grants.

A grant application form and budget request spreadsheet are available from pcg@auroville.org.in or may be downloaded from the same announcement on Auronet.

NB -If you have already received funding for a project through the PCG, please send in a progress report/status update (if the project is ongoing) or final report (if the project has been completed or all funds have been utilized) before making an application for a new grant.

Please note that if you are submitting a project that has anything to do with Auroville or Auroville Outreach schools, or, students of any individual classes, your project is to be reviewed by all concerned School Boards prior to the Project Coordination Group review. (Please contact all individual schools before submitting your proposal to them.) Therefore, it is important that all the relevant bodies (i.e. schools, teachers, school boards, etc.) are aware of your project and support it. In this way, the Project Coordination Group can more easily recommend a project for funding knowing it will have the support of schools and thereby have a greater impact on the beneficiaries of the project.

NOTE:

- The Newcomer probation year becomes effective only after the NC kit has been completed and returned. Be aware that the duration of the process cannot exceed 18 months from the date of confirmation.
- An Aurovilian is a resident of Auroville, aged 18 and above, whose name has been entered in the Register of Residents (RoR) as maintained by the Auroville Foundation (AVF) Office.
- The change of status from Newcomer to Aurovilian is official only once the individual has filled in and signed the B-Form. An Aurovilian's name is entered into the RoR after he/she has met with the Secretary of the AVF with an appointment arranged by the Entry Secretariat. These appointments are fixed by the Entry Secretariat according to the availability of the Secretary, but not at any personal request of an individual.
- The Auroville Foundation processes issuing of ID cards only to the Aurovilians who are registered in the RoR.

World Water Day, Global Recycling Day and Persistent Plastic

Indian Rainmakers /Change makers

The magazine Down To Earth reported on their travels to 16 villages in 15 districts of India to find water warriors and stewards. These are villages which started water harvesting with MNREGA - the country's employment guarantee program in the mid-2000's. They record the change over the past 15 years - how water has transformed lives. How did people invest in water security and made it work? These are stories of hope and of opportunity of the way ahead on this World Water Day. Some excerpts: "In villages like Bhuanpada and Mandekhela in Balangir district of Odisha, residents are intelligently reaping the twin benefits of employment available due to MGNREGA and improved agricultural production due to water-focused works under the program. This has made it financially viable for marginal farmers to stay in their villages - no mean feat in a state infamous for large-scale distress migration (six of the 20 blocks declared migrant-prone in the state are in Balangir). Pushpanjali Kumbhar, sarpanch of Mandekhela, says, "As many as 3,122 workers who used to migrate for work on a regular basis are registered under MGNREGA. They need to find work nearer home and we implement projects keeping them in mind."

Invisible everyday recycling - As we celebrated Global Recycling Day on March 18th, a report from Weather.com in Delhi appreciates local #RecyclingHeroes that are paving the way to a sustainable and cleaner future for everyone, despite their daily struggles. Shakuntala and Puran have been carrying out this responsibility for 13 years as waste segregation and disposal workers. Their day starts at 5 am in the morning, and ends during the wee hours of the night. From sweeping the streets to collecting the litter strewn by passersby, segregating the waste collected from nearby areas, and coordinating with the waste disposal trucks, they work tirelessly each day to provide an invaluable service.

Campaigns on recycling often forget about the very people who form the base of our waste management system and are an essential part of urban sustainability. Understanding their everyday struggles can help us keep our cities clean. The report introduces their large family consisting of 8 dogs, a rescued parrot, and multiple pigeons. Unlike regular office goers, their work and personal lives are deeply intertwined, as at the end of the day, they make their beds in front of the waste collection centre itself.

While there hasn't been much development in their work environment, they highly appreciate the construction of a 'Neki ki Deewar' or 'Wall of Giving' near their waste collection centre. They explained that in the spirit of recycling, people donate clothes for adults and children alike that are later used by people in need. This echoes the very basic sentiment of recycling- one person's waste can be another's treasure.

For wet waste, they are involved in executing a waste management policy under which people can exchange 5 kgs of wet waste for 1 kg of organic manure. The rest of the waste is transferred to the nearby landfill. They also mentioned that near this landfill, the wet waste is used to create biogas as well as manure in industrial plants.

Plastic Waste

The majority of the world is working together to reverse the massive plastic pollution problem. But, the world's leading producer of plastic waste, the U.S., hasn't signed on and isn't following the rules. In 2019, 187 countries, except for the U.S. and Haiti, voted to amend the 1989 Basel Convention to include plastic waste in the definition of hazardous materials, and to strictly limit how that trash is traded internationally. The binding framework hoped to make globally traded plastic waste more transparent and better regulated.

UN officials hoped the agreement would curb ocean plastic within five years. Supporters believed the convention would level the industry's global playing field by allowing developing nations such as Vietnam and Malaysia to refuse low-quality and hard-to-recycle plastics before they were shipped from developed nations. At the start of the year, when the new rules were just being implemented, the fact remained that the U.S. had not agreed to the amendment despite producing most of the world's plastic waste. Proponents held that the amendment would still apply to the U.S. anytime it tried to trade plastic waste with any of the participating 187 countries. According to the Basel Action Network (BAN), a nonprofit organization that lobbies against the plastic waste trade, participating nations are prohibited from trading waste with countries that have not ratified the Basel Convention. This creates an effective ban on plastic waste trade between the U.S. and most of the world, and makes U.S. plastic export shipments "criminal traffic as soon as the ships get on the high seas".

Despite these new rules, U.S. Customs data from January shows that optimism about the convention's effectiveness is premature. According to The New York Times, American exporters continue to ship plastic waste overseas, despite the fact that receiving countries have agreed not to accept it. In fact, overall exports of scrap plastics even rose. The Times reported that environmental watchdog groups viewed this as evidence that exporters are either ignoring the new rules or following their own interpretations. American companies are justifying waste shipments as being legal, using the logic that because the U.S. never ratified the global ban, the rules don't apply to originating shipments.

Much of the plastic waste collected in the U.S. under the guise of recycling actually ends up in overseas landfills and the oceans. In fact, a new Woods Hole study found that the U.S. is likely the world's third-largest source of ocean plastic, not just because it is the world's largest producer of plastic waste, but also because recyclables being sent to the developing world are often mishandled and discarded into the ocean.

"This is our first hard evidence that nobody seems to be paying attention to the international law," said Jim Puckett, BAN's executive director. "As soon as the shipments get on the high seas, it's considered illegal trafficking." David Azoulay, a Geneva-based lawyer with the Center for International Environmental Law, said: "You're starting to see an outcry in countries being flooded with waste. And we are already seeing more countries starting to put their foot down." He added that the more Americans "learn that their waste ends up in fields in Malaysia, or openly burned in Indonesia or Vietnam, it's not going to sit very well."

Don Lope is well-liked and well-known because of his honorable nature, despite his socialistic views about business and religion. But Don Lope's one weakness is women, and he falls for the innocent girl in his charge, seduces her, makes her his lover, though all the while explaining to her that she is as free as he. But when she acts on this freedom, Don Lope must deal with the consequences of his worldview.
