HOUSE OF MOTHER'S AGENDA



1 July 1970

The Mother: I had an experience which I found interesting, because it was the first time. It was yesterday or the day before (I forget), R. was here, just in front of me, kneeling, and I saw her psychic being towering above by this much (gesture about eight inches), taller. It's the first time. Her physical being was short, and the psychic being was tall, like this. And it was a sexless being: neither man nor woman. So I said to myself (it may be always that way, I don't know, but at that time I noticed it very clearly), I said to myself, "But the psychic being is the one that will materialize and become the supramental being!" I saw it, it was like that. There were distinctive features, but not very pronounced, and it was clearly a being that was neither male nor female, that had features of both combined. And it was taller than her, it exceeded her on every side by about this much (gesture extending beyond the physical being by about eight inches). She was here, and it was like this (gesture). Its color was... this color that, if it became very material, would be Auroville's color [orange]. It was softer, as if behind a veil, it wasn't absolutely precise, but it was this color. And there was hair, but... it was something else. Another time maybe I'll see better. But I found it very interesting, because that being seemed to tell me, "You're wondering what the supramental being will be - here it is! Here it is, this is it." And it was there. It was her psychic being.

Then one understands. One understands: the psychic being will materialize... and it gives a continuity to evolution. This creation gives you a clear impression that nothing is arbitrary, that there is a sort of divine logic behind, which isn't like our human logic, but highly superior to our logic (but it exists), and that logic was fully satisfied when I saw that. It's odd, it was also when R. was here that I had that experience of the supramental light going through within [Mother] without causing any shadow (See Agenda X of April 16 and May 3, 1969). R. has something like that, I don't know.... And this time, it's really interesting. I was quite interested. It was there, tranquil, and saying to me, "But you're after... well, here it is, this is it!" So then, I understood why the mind and the vital were sent away from this body, and the psychic being was left (naturally, it was the psychic being that governed all movements earlier, so it was nothing new, but there were no more difficulties: all the complications coming from the vital and the mind, which add their imprints, their tendencies, it was all gone). So I understood: "Ah, that's it, it's this psychic being that is to become the supramental being.

I had never bothered to know what it looked like. But when I saw that, I understood. And I see it, I still see it, I have kept the memory. Its hair almost looked red, strangely (it wasn't like red hair, but it looked like it). And its expression! Such a fine expression, gently ironical... oh, extraordinary, extraordinary! You understand, my eyes were open, it was an almost material vision. Then one understands! All at once, all questions vanished, it became very clear, very simple. (silence)

And the psychic is precisely what lives on. So if it materialized, it means doing away with death. But "doing away"... what's done away with is only what's not according to the Truth, that's what goes away - all that's incapable of being transformed in the image of the psychic, of being part of the psychic. That's really interesting.

Do we have time for some Savitri?

Satprem: Yes, Mother. In the last verses, Savitri said:

Let those who were tied to body and to mind, Tear off those bonds and flee into white calm

The Mother: Is it Savitri who says that? Satprem: Yes, Death told her one must leave one's body in order to find God's height...

But how shall I seek rest in endless peace Who house the mighty Mother's violent force, Her vision turned to read the enigmaed world, Her will tempered in the blaze of Wisdom's sun And the flaming silence of her heart of love? The world is a spiritual paradox

WORKING GROUP REPORTS

From the WC re: Confirmed Aurovilian Status

Encouraged to do so by feedback from concerned residents and the Entry Board/Service, we have revisited our previous interpretation and conclusion regarding when someone is considered to be 'Aurovilian'. We agree that the final decision of who is accepted as 'Aurovilian' should stay with the Residents' Assembly and not with the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. Therefore, we have written to:

- the Residents' Assembly Service that those who have been announced as Confirmed Aurovilian by the Entry Board are eligible to participate in all community decision-making processes along with those who have been entered into the Register of Residents maintained by the Secretary's Office;
- the Matrimandir that Confirmed Aurovilians can have access there in the same way as all other residents;
- the Residents' Service that Confirmed Aurovilians be entered into the Master List with the date of confirmation by the Entry Board as the Aurovilian date.

Ellen Eckelmann

This is to inform the community that Ellen Eckelmann experienced an epileptic crisis on the 28th of March, and two days later she left her body in her New Community home in Certitude. She was surrounded by her loved ones, her friends, the animals and bird song she loved so much. She was 79 and had been unwell since a motorcycle accident in June 2020.

Ellen, born in Berlin, Germany, came to Auroville in 1981 and was involved in the difficult situation of Auroville at the time. She had an export unit, brand Cocoon, and later supplied residents with a range of finely tailored clothing items, manufactured from her New Community tailoring workshop. After that, she went into theatre production resulting in a varied collection of well executed performances by Aurovilians. Also. during that period, the large New Community building with its various rooms was transformed into a guesthouse.

In October 2020, a new unexpected project took place at New-Community. Patricia, introduced by Miriam, her mentor at that time, suggested to help Ellen to awaken the community. Her idea was to welcome Newcomers, offering them a space of listening and sharing, as a support to accompany them in their process. Benevolence, mutual help and openness were the qualities selected to explore in New community. The project was born, and then Veronese completed the team.

Rapidly, some Newcomers interested in this community way of life, moved into the apartments of New-Community. Ellen could then let go and delegate, but her health condition started to shift in another way. All the members of New-Community gave time to support and care for Ellen. Despite her persistent state of fatigue and Alzheimer, the relationship built with her was beautiful. We mutually supported each other - us by our presence and care and Ellen by her openness, her beauty, her inner light and unconditional love which she would, without fail give us day after day. Her beauty and tenderness filled our hearts. Ellen's eternal perfume will accompany us in our daily routine in New-Community.

Ellen's remains were cremated at the Auroville Cremation Grounds in the late afternoon of Sunday 4th April. Our warmest condolences go out to daughter Miriam, (ex)husband Thomas and other good friends. Rest in Peace Ellen! ~ OM Shanti

- The Newcomer probation year becomes effective only after the NC kit has been completed and returned. Be aware that the duration of the process cannot exceed 18 months from the date of confirmation.
- An Aurovilian is a resident of Auroville, aged 18 and above, whose name has been entered in the Register of Residents (RoR) as maintained by the Auroville Foundation (AVF) Office.
- The change of status from Newcomer to Aurovilian is official only once the individual has filled in and signed the B-Form. An Aurovilian's name is entered into the RoR after he/she has met with the Secretary of the AVF with an appointment arranged by the Entry Secretariat. These appointments are fixed by the Entry Secretariat according to the availability of the Secretary, but not at any personal request of an individual.
- The Auroville Foundation processes issuing of ID cards only to the Aurovilians who are registered in the RoR.

Update from the Citizens' Assembly

Last month we shared the water vision crafted by the participants of the Citizens' Assembly, so we now want to share

some of the more practical ideas that were developed by assembly members.

Throughout the Citizens' Assembly the members were asked to consider practical actions needed for the water vision to be realised. The assembly was tasked to identify potential actions and then indicate how much they wanted to see them happen, so that this could give an indication to water players and the wider community where action is needed. This resulted in a list of 57 ideas listed according to how much support/interest there was to see them happen (details of which will be shared on auronet).

On World Water Day (22nd March) many of Auroville's water players met, along with some of the participants and organisers from the Assembly and representatives from several bio-regional

organisations. This group (of around 30-40 people) used the time to explore how to move forward with these actions. Water players were also presented with posters and tote bags with the vision printed in English, French and Tamil. Those present chose 6 ideas they would like to begin work on (sometimes combining multiple ideas) and formed small teams to take these forward.

These ideas chosen by the teams for immediate action are:

• Create a community endorsed independent/neutral implementation group to coordinate works & take decisions on water issues, consulting with existing groups/experts & connecting to (& supporting) those interested in water

• Create AV water budget mandated by community - which is accountable

• Establish system(s) to capture & share understandable, transparent, accurate, beautiful data on water (pollution levels in wastewater, well levels, number of borewells etc) which can be accessed by to community to inform their behaviour & decisions

• Explore ways to strengthen collaboration with bioregion on water - potentially through existing bio-regional partners, 2 way sharing of experience/ideas, bio-regional planning etc

• Water Matters Mela - Invite community to respond to vision through inspirational, joyful celebration of water (annual water festival)/ using visual representation, theatre, dance, roadshows for bioregional schools etc

• Bring stakeholders - experts, users, governance - together to explore blockages to working together (with support from skilled mediator).

#### Earth Day 2021, April 22nd: <u>"Restore Our Earth"</u>

This year is the 51st anniversary of Earth Day. Every year has a theme and this time it's "Restore our Earth." Most years, Earth Day events range from river cleanups to removals of invasive plants. With social distancing still in place, Earth Day has gone digital. Virtual events, such as environmental lectures and films can be seen at <u>earthday.org</u>. Social distancing doesn't mean that you can't go outside and enjoy nature, as long as you do so responsibly, Nature is not canceled!

The first Earth Day was held on April 22, 1970. Dealing with dangerously serious issues concerning toxic drinking water, air pollution, and the effects of pesticides, an impressive 20 million Americans–10% of the population–ventured outdoors and protested together. President Richard Nixon created the Environmental Protection Agency, which lead to successful laws including the Clean Air Act, the Clean Water Act, and the Endangered Species Act. Today, Earth Day is not just a day meant to increase awareness of environmental problems, but also to be a time for communities to gather to clean up litter, plant trees, or simply reflect on the beauty of nature. Below is a summary of upcoming events:

#### Three Days of Climate Action

\* April 20th; Earth Day 2021 begins with a global youth climate summit led by Earth Uprising, in collaboration with My Future My Voice, OneMillionOfUs and hundreds of youth climate activists. The global youth summit will consist of panels, speeches, discussions, and special messages with today's youth climate activists In the evening, the Hip Hop Caucus and its partners will present the "We Shall Breathe" virtual summit to examine climate and environmental justice, connecting the climate crisis to issues of pollution, poverty, police brutality, and the pandemic, all within a racial justice framework.

\* April 21st: Education International will lead the "Teach for the Planet: Global Education Summit." This will span several time zones and feature prominent activists from every continent, focused on the crucial role that educators play in combating climate change and why we need transformative climate education now.

\* APRIL 22<sup>nd</sup>/ Earth Day Parallel to the Biden Administration's global climate summit, EARTHDAY.ORG will host workshops, panel discussions, and special performances. Topics include Climate and environmental literacy, Climate restoration technologies, Reforestation, Regenerative agriculture, Equity and environmental justice, Citizen science, Cleanups, and more.

Meanwhile, where does Auroville stand? In these hectic and fickle times in the 14th month of the Covid pandemic, in the middle of a heatwave, pesticide spraying, land encroachment/ disputes, polarized debates on infrastructure versus ecology, increasing traffic and unwanted visitors/parties with attendant sound pollution and the threat of tarring of roads amidst election chaos, Auroville is faced with ever-increasing environmental issues that have to be solved. Can Auroville pause and meditate on our place and purpose here? What do we stand for within the bioregion, India, the world? Can we see the greater picture?

One of us posted a petition on Auronet to propose **divesting our bank savings** away from companies responsible for the climate crisis (Adani, Shell, etc.). So far, 22 residents have signed and we'll soon follow up with ideas on how to take this further. If you are interested and have not yet signed the proposal, please write to <u>gijs@auroville.org.in</u>.

Similar movements are afoot across the world to avoid making things worse -even if we're not confident that we can actually make things better. One of these campaigns is pushing the government of France to **stop bankrolling oil and gas drilling in the Arctic.** French oil giant Total wants to pump the equivalent of 535,000 barrels of oil per day from under the Arctic's fragile ice, which could make this one of the most polluting projects in the world. France's President called the project "incoherent" and "reckless". But he is under pressure to fund it anyway.

The Arctic is home to indigenous communities like the Gwich'in, the Inuit, and the Sámi (see more about <u>indigenous peoples of the Arctic</u> by the Arctic Center of the University of Lapland). It

also shelters many endangered species like polar bears, narwhals & penguins. The risk to the Arctic landscape and life are high, including methane explosions, pollution and deadly heat waves. Across France, activists from the organisation 350.org and SumOfUs are raising awareness and mobilising support. In Australia similar campaigns are under way to prevent Indian corporate Adani to dig up more coal. This Earth Day we invite you to take a moment to find your green voice and speak up. Nature is not in lockdown, but unfortunately neither is corporate destruction of it...

Some points to be kept in mind when reading the "Notes on the presentations made during the Forest Group/Youth Centre GM of 27-03-202" by ATDC

- The brief for the Environmental Impact Assessment was given by the TDC itself. The coordinator of the EIA was in contact with the TDC throughout the process. The fact that no EIA has been carried out for the remaining areas of the HT cable ring is clearly a neglect on the side of the TDC. - The repeated mention of an "*increase by 30%*" is misleading, as it applies to the section in the Bliss area alone, not placing it into the context of the entire ring. The segment of the Crown crossing Bliss forest makes up around 6% of the entire HT cable ring, an increase of length by 30% in this segment results in an increase of length of the entire ring by 1.8%. Efficiency loss by 1.8% can be considered as insignificant.

- The Bliss forest area accounts only for 6% of the "flag-end of the HT ring mains installation work of which only the last 8% needs to be completed". The remaining 2% need to cross or bypass non-AV plots (two private and two temple land plots). What is the strategy with regards to these last 2%?

The one point we do appreciate in the "notes" is the encouragement of community participation in town planning & development. As we made clear throughout the process and in our presentations, we do want to participate in a collaborative town planning and development process. As none of the current members of TDC have expertise in town planning, we suggest to make an active effort to include Aurovilians who do have this expertise.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF 24th APRIL DARSHAN DAY - The Mother's Final Arrival at Pondicherry Monday, 12th April, 4 PM

Dr Alok Pandey reflects upon Vedanta and Tantra, the best aspects of Western and Eastern culture and the unique relationship between the Mother and Sri Aurobindo. He discusses in detail the role and potential of the Purusha and the Shakti. Sri Aurobindo as the Supreme Purusha is the witness self; in the

Gita it is the Purushottama. He stands silent sanctioning all that is happening and yet he is unmoved, like the sun in the sky.

Here, in this world the purusha has so far been a diminished godhead and the purusha within "not bigger than the thumb of man". But now it is going to change: the purusha has to recover and discover its own godhead, the Ishvara. The purusha will go to the birthplace of the godhead and will discover its supramental godhead and its supramental personality.

On the other hand, the Mother presents the Divine Shakti, the power that is going into the creation. She organizes all the processes and details of life and is inspiring the art of culture. So far, the shakti has been active through the limited and divided consciousness. It is what we call nature or prakriti, which mostly acts mechanically, is partly conscious and partly unconscious, and yet behind it stands perfect consciousness, which limits itself to the needs of each species. Prakriti is the diminished form of Mahashakti and also has to gain and regain her own glory and splendor. Nature in us is toiling and struggling in darkness and is yearning to return to its spiritual home and its oneness, light, truth, bliss, sweetness, and love.

The evolutionary need to bring the Spirit and Nature together is impelling. And for this great work and realisation Sri Aurobindo and the Divine Mother have come together. During their meeting on 24 April 1920 on the Mother's final arrival to Pondicherry, both immediately felt that "now the realisation will be accomplished". The Mahashakti, the Mother, totally surrendered to Sri Aurobindo, and the Supreme Purusha, Sri Aurobindo, instructed and installed the Divine Mother as the guiding and moving force who would henceforth govern and direct our human race along the pathways that are intended and willed by the Divine. And in the symbolic expression of the shift towards the Supramental, the Shakti sits on the right side of the Purusha and executes the will of the Divine. Duration: 37min.
