

"Is India Civilized?" - 1

(continued from last week)

"The warning cannot be neglected; recent utterances of European publicists and statesmen, recent books and writings against India and the joyful and enthusiastic welcome they have received from the public of occidental countries, point to the reality of the danger. It arises indeed as a necessity from the present political situation and cultural trend of humanity at this moment of enormous decisive change. It is not necessary to follow the writer in all the viewpoints expressed in his book. I cannot myself accept in full his eulogy of the mediaeval civilisation of Europe. Its interest, the beauty of its artistic motives, its deep and sincere spiritual urgings are marred for me by its large strain of ignorance and obscurantism, its cruel intolerance, its revolting early-Teutonic hardness, brutality, ferocity and coarseness. He seems to me to hit a little too hard at the later European culture. This predominantly economic type of civilisation has been ugly enough in its strain of utilitarian materialism, which we shall err grossly if we imitate; still it has been uplifted by some nobler ideals that have done much for the race. But even these are crude and imperfect in their form and need to be spiritualised in their meaning before they can be wholly admitted by the mind of India. I think too that the author has a little underrated the force of the Indian revival. I do not mean its outward realised strength, for that is very deficient, but the inevitability of its drive, its spiritual and potential force. And he has made a little too much of the servile type of Indian who is capable of mouthing the portentously obsequious imagination that"European institutions are the standard by which the aspirations of India are set." That, except for the rapidly dwindling class to which this spokesman belongs, has its truth now only in a single field, the political, — a very important exception, I admit, and one which opens the door to a peril of stupendous proportions. But even there a deep change of spirit is foreshadowed although it has not yet taken definite form and has now to meet a fresh invasion of furious Europeanism inspired by the militant crudeness of proletarian Russia. Again he does not attach a sufficient importance to the increasing infiltration of India's spiritual thought into Europe and America, which is her characteristic retort to the European invasion. It is from this point of view that the whole question takes on a different aspect.

Sir John Woodroffe invites us to a vigorous self-defence. But defence by itself in the modern struggle can only end in defeat, and, if battle there must be, the only sound strategy is a vigorous aggression based on a strong, living and mobile defence; for by that aggressive force alone can the defence itself be effective.

Why are a certain class of Indians still hypnotised in all fields by European culture and why are we all still hypnotised by it in the field of politics? Because they constantly saw all the power, creation, activity on the side of Europe, all the immobility or weakness of a static inefficient defence on the side of India. But wherever the Indian spirit has been able to react, to attack with energy and to create with éclat, the European glamour has begun immediately to lose its hypnotic power. No one now feels the weight of the religious assault from Europe which was very powerful at the outset, because the creative activities of the Hindu revival have made Indian religion a living and evolving, a secure, triumphant and self-assertive power. But the seal was put to this work by two events, the Theosophical movement and the appearance of Swami Vivekananda at Chicago. For these two things showed the spiritual ideas for which India stands no longer on their defence but aggressive and invading the materialised mentality of the Occident. All India had been vulgarised and anglicised in its aesthetic notions by English education and influence, until the brilliant and sudden dawn of the Bengal school of art cast its rays so far as to be seen in Tokio, London and Paris. That significant cultural event has already effected an aesthetic revolution in the country, not yet by any means complete, but irresistible and sure of the future. The same phenomenon extends to other fields. Even in the province of politics that was the internal sense of the policy of the socalled extremist party in the Swadeshi movement; for it was a movement which attempted to override the previous apparent impossibility of political creation by the Indian spirit upon other than imitative European lines. If it failed for the time being, not by any falsity in its inspiration, but by the strength of a hostile pressure and the weakness still left by a past decadence, if its incipient creations were broken or left languishing and deprived of their original significance, yet it will remain as a finger-post on the roads. The attempt is bound to be renewed as soon as a wider gate is opened under more favourable conditions. Till that attempt comes and succeeds, a serious danger besets the soul of India; for a political Europeanisation would be followed by a social turn of the same kind and bring a cultural and spiritual death in its train. Aggression must be successful and creative if the defence is to be effective."

"So long as war does not become psychologically impossible, it will remain or, if banished for a while, return. War itself, it is hoped, will end war; the expense, the horror, the butchery, the disturbance of tranquil life, the whole confused sanguinary madness of the thing has reached or will reach such colossal proportions that the human race will fling the monstrosity behind it in weariness and disgust. But weariness and disgust, horror and pity, even the opening of the eyes to reason by the practical fact of the waste of human life and energy and the harm and extravagance are not permanent factors; they last only while the lesson is fresh. Afterwards, there is forgetfulness; human nature recuperates itself and recovers the instincts that were temporarily dominated. A long peace, even a certain organisation of peace may conceivably result, but so long as the heart of man remains what it is, the peace will come to an end, the organisation will break down under the stress of human passions. War is no longer, perhaps, a biological necessity, but it is still a psychological necessity; what is within us, must manifest itself outside.

Meanwhile it is well that every false hope and confident prediction should be answered as soon as may well be by the irony of the gods; for only so can we be driven to the perception of the real remedy. Only when man has developed not merely a fellow-feeling with all men, but a dominant sense of unity and commonalty, only when he is aware of them not merely as brothers, — that is a fragile bond, — but as parts of himself, only when he has learned to live not in his separate personal and communal ego-sense, but in a larger universal consciousness can the phenomenon of war, with whatever weapons, pass out of his life without the possibility of return. Meanwhile that he should struggle even by illusions towards that end, is an excellent sign; for it shows that the truth behind the illusion is pressing towards the hour when it may become manifest as reality."

Luigi was one of Auroville's more striking figures who played many a role in Auroville's development. Hailing from

Ravenna, Italy, where he undertook humanistic studies at the Bologna University, he came to Auroville when he was 22 and joined a few years later, becoming an ardent developer, fundraiser and networker. In 1980 he started the development of Transformation in the Cultural Zone, from 1987 till 89 he took care of the Matrimandir Nursery. From 1990 onwards he coordinated Auroville's Future, and was project manager of two Asia Urbs projects while participating as a speaker for Auroville at numerous national and international conferences and exhibitions both in and outside Auroville. In liaison with UNESCO and the Government of India, he has been instrumental in raising funds for several projects and events in Auroville. After serving in the Auroville Planning and Development group, he functioned in his later years as executive of Auroservice, continuing his network from there. We salute yet another member of the Old Guard. Our warmest condolences go out to his sister Diana, daughter Auroyami and her mom Aryamani, and his niece Divya.

WHY IT IS IMPORTANT: RAD ON THE CURRENT WCOM

"Auroville is the attempt towards collective realisation."

The Mother, June 1968

"Auroville will be a site of material and spiritual research for a living embodiment of an actual human unity."

Why is the Working Committee an important group of Auroville?

The Working Committee is the interface between the Auroville community and the rest of the world. Its mandate is to represent the Residents' Assembly in interactions with the Governing Board, International Advisory Council and the Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. It is meant to represent Residents' Assembly, by being at the service of its collective voices. For, as the Mother said "Auroville is the attempt towards collective realization." (June 1968).

Why is it important, now more than ever, to have a healthy, functioning and capable Working Committee?

At this time of crisis, we need to find a way forward together. We need a Working Committee that is committed to nurturing the growth of our collective body, and works for harmonious solutions when differences arise. One that upholds our community's best interests before the interests of others. In the events leading up to and in Dec 2021, many of us

In the events leading up to and in Dec 2021, many of us witnessed that certain members of the Working Committee pushed for "the city at all cost" in a dogmatic way – at the expense of human unity, and of our freedom to decide from within. As a result, a split happened in the Working Committee. Since then, the team has been dysfunctional. Some Working Committee members have explicitly stated that they do not seek to represent the Residents' Assembly, and have tried to expel the other members who continue to try their best to assist the community. Clearly, the current team is not able to represent and assist the Residents' Assembly, which is its task and purpose.

This is frustrating for many Aurovilians, including the members of the Working Committee themselves. Everyone can feel that this split within the Working Committee is harmful for Auroville. It deepens divisions in the community and weakens our interface with outside forces, some of which are threatening.

Some members of the Working Committee have denied and rejected the authority of the Residents' Assembly as a decision-making body before the Governing Board and Secretary of the Auroville Foundation. This is very concerning: Auroville has limited meaning if our collective consciousness is not allowed to develop, grow and be nurtured through co-creating and realising this place together.

Why would we 'de-select' members if we stand for human unity?

These are intense times. We are all experiencing this in our life and work, we feel it in our heart and soul. With this intensity comes a push to work for our growth, inner and outer. In such times it is important that we work intensely together, to break old patterns and formations, and that we work hard in bridging our gaps. Given this, why would we 'de-select' members of the Working Committee?

There have been calls for the Working Committee to figure out how to work together, in the spirit of human unity in diversity. They have not been able to do so. Now, with four members attempting to expel the other three by a majority vote, it seems clear this is not possible with the current constellation of Working Committee members.

We need to address this dysfunctionality. To also avoid the vacuum that would be created if the whole team were asked to step down, we need to take a call on which members we would like to request to step down, and which we would trust to continue to act as Working Committee members.

For some it feels uncomfortable to ask people to step down. However, we are in an exceptional situation in which some Working Committee members have explicitly rejected their mandate, which is to represent the community. As such they are abusing the power vested in the position they were

voted into. For Auroville's Working Groups to function, individual members need to be able to put their personal preferences and agendas aside in order to represent the diversity of the community.

The current RAD is a call to establish a Working Committee we trust in nurturing our collective and bringing the Residents' Assembly back into the centre of the growth of Auroville – so that we can work towards a living embodiment of an actual human unity!

By asking those who have led the community into a stalemate to step down, an opening will be available to those who are ready to represent the Residents' Assembly and to take up the challenge of fostering unity in moving forward.

Why is it safe to vote in this RAD?

- Voting is anonymous. The system only checks that all voters are Aurovilians. It is fully confidential whether you vote or not, and what you vote for.
- This RAD is completely legitimate. The Residents' Assembly has the full and exclusive authority to choose its representatives and how long they are to serve, through any method, which includes this RAD.

On the legitimacy of the Residents' Assembly and this RAD

Some Aurovilians, including some current Working Committee members, have taken the extreme position that the Residents' Assembly is not even required in decision-making. How can that be? The Residents' Assembly is the voice of a collective evolution in process. We all feel that we still have a long way to go. And this journey is what The Mother called us here for. Legally speaking, even the Auroville Foundation Act (1988), Sec 19 (b) states that the Residents' Assembly is responsible for organising activities relating to Auroville. In regards to the allegations from community members who take the extreme position that some of our decisions are illegitimate, including this RAD on the Working Committee, it should be noted that the Working Committee has been selected by Residents' Assembly decision-making processes for the last 20 years. The current Working Committee was selected by a legitimate and recognised RA decision-making process, and its membership is currently being brought to the community by a valid RA decision-making process.

We all know that our collective decision-making processes are far from ideal, and hope to see these evolve. Some of us don't even want to engage in these processes because we find them unsatisfactory. But these processes are the only way for us Aurovilians to make legitimate decisions together, and as such, they must be respected and upheld. Until better processes are approved by the Residents' Assembly, until we find better ways of organising ourselves, we need to use what we have. And pursue our attempts towards collective progress.

Why is it important to participate in the WCom RAD, even if we find it disagreeable?

Given the current untenable situation within the Working Committee, and the pressures Auroville is under from without and from within, there is a need to ensure a team that is committed to standing for the community and nurtures our unity. For these reasons, it is especially important that we all participate in this Residents' Assembly decision on the current Working Committee. Even if we wish it hadn't come to this. Even if we wish we had better ways to address this. This is the reality we have to transform, together – and we have a chance to do so, today.

RAD ON THE PROPOSAL

"I agree to remove individual members of the Working Committee from office through this current RA decisionmaking process..."

Dear Residents, this is a gentle reminder about the Residents' Assembly Decision-making process (RAD) to approve or disapprove the following proposal:

"I agree to remove individual members of the Working Committee from office through this current RA decision-making process, given their failure to 'assist' and 'represent' the Residents' Assembly as stated in their mandate. If more than 50% of voters agree that a member is to be removed, the term of that member ends with immediate effect.

I agree that any remaining members of the Working Committee will continue in office and can choose to appoint interim members. They can only do so in consultation with the Auroville Council.

These interim members can only be chosen from members of previous Working Committees. The term of the interim Working Committee members shall be until the next RAapproved Selection Process has been held, and new Working Committee members have been selected.

In the unlikely event that all Working Committee members are dismissed, the three Working Committee members who have the most votes to stay on will remain, as interim members, until the next RA-approved selection process".



Building Application

Mantra Staff Quarters extension. Industrial Zone BA B 2550 to extend Staff quarters

Applicant: Angad Vohra

Architect/ designer/contractor: Monda Doctor-Pingel

Community/Area: Mantra/Industrial Zone Area for which final NOC is sought: 31,66sqm

Project brief: K. Sathyamoorthy has been Aurovillian for two years and is being groomed to take over the unit. He has lived intermittently on the premises since 1999. He lives there now but needs to add an identical room and Bathroom. Applicants would like to add 24sqm to the existing 43,70sqm. Project is worth 5.58.128/- and it will be financed by the unit.

The project holder can begin construction on site after picking up the signed NOC document from the ATDC office.

Karin's house extension Discipline. BA B 2546 to add walls to the existing structure to create bedroom

Applicant: Karin Latzke

Architect/ designer/contractor: N. Amurugam Community/Area: Horizon/Industrial Zone Area for which final NOC is sought: 22.59sqm

Project brief: The existing structure had no walls for a protected bedroom. The existing bedroom for Arjunan in the main building is very small and not sufficient anymore. Applicants would like to add walls in order to create a proper bedroom. They would like to add 22,59smg to the existing 39,22sqm structure. Project is worth 3.78.750/and it will be privately funded - partially by private funds, partially by the funds left over from the housing transfer.

The project holder can begin construction on site after picking up the signed NOC document from the ATDC office.

• Auropriya Dhandapani house. Demolition 2541: to demolish the existing dilapidated house and replace it with a new one

Applicant: Auropriya Dhandapani

Community/Area: Aurelec/Outside Master Plan

Project brief: It is an old building whose roof is made of ferro cement mold which has been leaking lately. The house is built with a single brick wall. It is a two bedroom residence of a ground floor structure of 80 sqm built up area.

Because of the leakage problem residents are suffering with health issues due to over humidity and moisture.

The project holder can begin demolition on site after picking up the signed NOC document from the ATDC office.

Preliminary Design Approval

• **Joel: Surrender block 1** 3rd floor PDA 2532. Application for Preliminary Design Approval

Applicant: Kaliananda Josephine

Architect/ Designer: Sindhuja Jagadeesh

Community/ area: Surrender/Residential Zone 1

Area for which approval is sought: 97sqm

Project brief: In 2013 Block 1 of Surrender was completed as part of phase 2 development of Surrender.

Since then the building has been experiencing major leaks owing to a lot of ferrocement boxes in the elevation as well as the burnt rice husk filling below the inverted floor slab on the roof terrace.

Over the years the residents have cut out a lot of the ferrocement to minimize leaks but the roof with the rice husk filling has worsened with time and weakened the concrete slab below.

When the residents did a consultation with the architect Sindhuja, it was recommended that the entire upper floor be covered with a roof on the third floor level of this G+2 building. Since several lakhs will go into making this new roof, we

proposed that with an additional few lakhs, an apartment can be made available for Kaliananda as a permanent resident of the building.

The extension would take care of extending the life of existing building by another 20-30 years as well provide housing option to an Aurovilian.

The residence is planned for 2 bedrooms, bathroom, kitchen, living room and terrace. Project is worth 22.66.472/and it will be funded privately by Kaliananda. Design made by Sindhuja Jagadeesh.

This is a preliminary design stage, to which final building NOC would be required before the construction starts on the site.

A confirmed Aurovilian becomes officially a Resident of Auroville once the individual has filled in and signed the B-Form and his/her name has been entered in the Register of Residents (RoR) maintained by the Auroville Foundation Office (AVF).

A Resident of Auroville is eligible to become an executive of a Unit or Service of Auroville and to get an ID card issued by the Auroville Foundation.

A meeting with the Secretary of the AVF will be arranged by the Entry Secretariat according to the availability of the Secretary and not at any personal request.



"Follow the Data: Invest in Midwives" (the theme of 2021)



Midwives stand for safe, respectful and conscious Birthing. Midwives are with the mothers in their time of birthing that often comes with unknown challenges; they are with the mothers also before and after birth.

Midwives remind us that Birth is a Natural and Sacred event rather than a threatening medical emergency.

Midwives in many places of this world walk miles to reach a mother and the growing new life within her – and often receive no more than a warm meal for it.

Midwives have what it takes for a mother to birth the way she has been entitled to since birth: the KNOWLEDGE to ensure a safe and respectful birth, the EXPERTISE to teach about different options of birth, the LOVE to receive this baby as blissful as possible and imprint it positively for the rest of her / his life.

Midwives take care of what really matters: keeping mothers and babies together in their first hour after birth (this definitely most impactfully empowering way is too often overlooked due to often unnecessary medical procedures). Midwives know that delayed cord clamping as well as breastfeeding at least for the first year make a huge difference to the whole life of this new being. Midwives stand for Human Rights in Birthing.



HELP NEEDED

AUROORCHARD NEEDS SUPPORT FOR HOUSING FOR YOUNG AUROVILIAN



Dear community, we are reaching out to you for your support in helping us finish the construction of our staff quarters.

As you are aware, housing is a big challenge in our community and more so for farms. Lack of housing options and limited number of maintenances have been

part of the reason for lack of Aurovilians working on the farms, which itself is a big challenge for Auroville's food sustainability.

In 1985, the farm built a few rooms near the main office for the purpose of storage. Christian, who worked at AuroOrchard from 2012-2019 started to upgrade this building in 2016 to make a house for himself. When he left in 2019, the building was only half done. We felt we'd continue to finish it and offer it to Aurovilians working long term on the farm. However, due to lack of funds and some paperwork, this project remained on pause.

Now, we would like to complete this building to provide a house for Ramanan, Meera and their 1 year old daughter Medhini.

Ramanan has been living and working at the farm since 2017 and is part of the farm's management team. The house he currently lives in is an old structure which needs significant repair and is not at all suitable for a family. Meera, his wife, is a third generation Aurovillian. They both work in the services of Auroville and receive maintenances. Meera is currently on maternity leave.

As this house is a farm asset it is not possible to get a grant from housing. Loan options are available but the interest rates are quite high and the farm is not in a financial capacity to commit to paying the interest amounts. After trying several options, we are reaching out to you all. We feel it is our collective responsibility to ensure that young and committed farmers are supported.

We need 7 lakh rupees to complete the structure. Of course, we will continue our efforts to raise these funds, but any help from your side will be highly appreciated. 



The language of whales

2019 / 42 minutes / Volker Barth

A team of researchers headed by Professor Elmar Noeth and Rachael Cheng from the University of Erlangen-Nuremberg spent three years collecting data on the movements and vocalization of various orca pods in the Pacific. Their aim was to investigate a possible connection between the patterns of the killer whales' calls and their behaviour and human languages. Using special microphones, they captured the underwater sounds and behaviors of these marine mammals. Then they tried to determine the whales' position and classify their calls. It's a first step towards solving the mysteries of whale song. It also helps us understand how similar or dissimilar they are from ourselves

Using artificial intelligence to decipher unfamiliar communications systems is not without its difficulties. However, it's already clear that Al will transform our ideas about highly communicative species in the coming years.

PUDUCHERRY: NGT DIRECTS AUROVILLE TO PURSUE CROWN PROJECT ON PANEL'S ADVICE

Foundation told to prepare a proper township plan and obtain environmental clearance before undertaking construction

The Southern Bench of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) has

directed Auroville Foundation not to fell any more trees for the Crown road project until a Joint committee, appointed by it, conducts an inspection of the plan site and submits a report.

The NGT also directed the Foundation to prepare a proper township plan and obtain environmental clearance before undertaking construction in the project area earmarked for establishing an international township as envisioned by its founder Mirra Alfassa, or The Mother, the spiritual collaborator of Sri Aurobindo.

Passing orders on a petition by an Auroville resident Navroz Kersasp Mody, the Southern Bench, comprising judicial member Justice K. Ramakrishnan and expert member K. Satyagopal, stipulated that the joint committee inspect the area and find out whether by reducing the width of the road at suitable places or through a slight realignment, the number of trees to be cut could be minimized in accordance with The Mother's vision of creating a green cover.

While granting conditional permission to the Foundation to complete the Crown road "considering it as an exceptional circumstance, even before obtaining environmental clearance for further activity", the NGT said the joint committee would have the Collector, who is the chairman of the District Green Committee, the Forest Officer not below the rank of Conservator of Forest, as deputed by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, and the Chief Wildlife Warden, Tamil Nadu.

It directed the joint committee to ascertain whether there were any water bodies/streams in that area. If the road passed through the waterbody, it should spell out the way in which the road would have to be constructed by elevation, without affecting the waterbody/water flow, or with a bed-level causeway with a box type of vents. If such a recommendation was made, it would have to be implemented, and the Foundation should undertake the construction as suggested by the committee.

The joint committee must complete the process and submit the report to the Foundation Respondent within two months. On receipt of the same, the Foundation should carry out the work, in the impugned area with tree cover, strictly in accordance with the recommendations made by the joint committee, the order said. "Till that exercise is completed, the Foundation is directed not to cut any further trees from the property".

The Foundation is free to undertake the road work in the remaining stretches where there are no trees and take action against unauthorized occupations, if any, in accordance with the law in force, the order said.

The NGT also directed the Foundation to prepare the township plan either in respect of 778 hectares, which is in its possession, or in respect of 1963 hectares, which was visualized by The Mother by identifying the locations where each zone will have to be located. The plan should also map locations where the roads will have to be laid, showing the location of the ring roads with their width and of more roads, if any, to be constructed, the nature of industries and other activities which are likely to be established in the township. The Foundation should also indicate the number of phases of work and apply for environmental clearance as it will fall under Item 8 (b) of the EIA Notification, 2006, as amended from time to time, the NGT said.

"Till then, they (the Foundation) are directed not to proceed with further construction in the project area", the order said.

The issue reached the NGT in December amid an escalation of protests by a section of Aurovilians against the razing down of trees for the project and allegations that the Foundation was developing a township on the basis of a master plan that was not approved by any authority, and without a feasibility impact assessment study or a detailed project report.

NOTES OF EXCHANGE WITH THE COMMUNITY DURING GM HOSTED BY AUROVILLE COUNCIL (AVC)

On Monday, 18 April, 2022

• Question (Q) by Sabine:

All WGs should have regular community meetings. Community was infantilised without information, without enough exchange. Then we are asked to vote on things we don't know about, we don't understand the consequences. I've noticed our Council members and other groups are not up to date with most policies, or what's happening, our structures. I hope in the next selection we have more knowledgeable people.

Question on appeal process review, what is happening? Appeal document says that every single case will be closely documented and reviewed, including all parties. – How many appeals have happened and how many have been included/talked to in the review? I was not included.

Response (R): 22 or 24 appeals in the last year.

Q: How many appellants were consulted? *Paused*. Why was I not consulted? *Paused*.

Appeal review is by who?

R: The review is being done by the Arbiters Coordination team (Niva, Thera), Martin and AVC.

AVC should update about the membership of subgroups every month or regularly.

 ${\bf R}$: good idea, we will try to improve the communication of this in future.

Q: about missing members of the Council in GM?

R: Shiva could not come at the last minute as there was a death in his family and the other two have not been coming for some time now.

Mita:

Questioning whether working groups follow their mandate. I feel we are on fire but acting like nothing is happening.

Q1: Is it true that the Secretary has signed an agreement of 20 Crore with CPWD (Central Public work Department) which is a building agency of the Govt to build the crown road? Major issue is the functioning of ATDC that there are only 2 people left there. People are being appointed without any of us knowing. RA seems to have no role.

Q2: Also heard that 20 people are going to be appointed to design the City, ignoring the Dreamweavers and RA has no role? As a community this is a burning issue, we need to do something. A few have lost their mandate. We are on fire, this is going out of control.

R: This information is new to Council, we are on fire every-day, but we will get back to you.

But ATDC selection will happen soon. Selection process may be ratified tomorrow. In the last year many extreme things have happened. We have not had much contact with ATDC, receiving no replies from them. We know the memberships are changing periodically at ATDC, trying to keep up with it, and have given 2 announcements about their membership in the last months. An RAD looking at the validity of the ATDC office order should begin shortly. The ATDC issue is very old. 1 years ago the big topic was the harmonization of the 2017 restructuring of ATDC with

the 2019 standing order. The other issue is who does the ATDC answer to, GB or RA. RA must select up to 13 ATDC members, now there are no members selected by the RA.

Mita it's not acceptable that ATDC has not been chosen by the RA. This is an emergency. We need to do something right now, this is crazy. I request that the Council find out if this info is true.

R: For us, the situation at ATDC was so confusing and strange we did not know what to do. Who do we speak to or approach? No response to emails.

Mita says something needs to happen.

R: the upcoming RAD is the solution, with new members the problem should be solved. Maybe the Council could speak with the secretary but historically the WCom is responsible for communication with the AVF office and GB.

Sauro from WC responds: WCom doesn't have any information about the 20 crore project or budget. But there is a tendency to want to use the Center Public Work Department (CPWD) for the implementation of the Govt projects. One can also find this info on the Auronet under TDC presentation. The GB minutes will also be shared with the community in the next few days and maybe there will be more information. Wcom has not met the Secretary for the past 2 weeks.

Claudine from AVC: we have to know what is our situation as a RA. We don't know what some working groups (WG) are doing. If we feel there is an emergency, we need to meet, we need to act independently from the working groups..

Flisa:

Resonates with what Mita said that there may be a fire and requests that more RA meetings are held to connect better with the community. What is the Council's experience with WCom as you are the one responsible for the good functioning of the WG?

R: We admit that we as a group were impacted from the beginning. Usually we look at challenging situations together, this year became more and more difficult. We saw the difficulty in their team. There were members from WCom that didn't want AVC interference, so we were lacking confidence and experience to push for meditation between the WCom members. We could see that if the WCom is not functioning well it is detrimental especially in a crisis situation. They were not available most of the time.

· Eric:

Q1: What would AVC need to strengthen implementation of your decisions?

Q2: Is there a subgroup that handles feedback?

R: People tend not to want WG to have more power. And when push comes to shove if people don't want to listen then what can we do? We will think about what we would need to improve implementation. We should ask ourselves as a community how we can help each other to stick to and honor RA decisions.

R: Council doesn't have a subgroup for feedback. We're a small team and respond as best we can. How do we create feedback loops? We need to reflect on this.

There was something called the clearance panel related to clearing people of feedback for selection processes. But this is not constituted at the moment.

 Tom: There needs to be a dialogue between RA and WGs more regularly.

Fabian:

I ask myself what can I and others do, as I question the entire way that we govern ourselves. RA as a body is increasingly sidelined. 4 members of WCom openly disqualify the RA for participating in building our city. ATDC undergoing restructuring without RA input or answering questions. AVC mandate point 4 says that your role is to ensure and facilitate good functioning of the WGs. When WGs are going berserk you have to go to the GB and AVF office.

It's the core element of what AVC members signed up to do. If you can't do it or feel powerless you should step back. Don't pretend to be a functioning WG.

R: historically AVC usually does not interact with the GB or the Secretary, this is the work of WCom. Only if we are created under clause 19(3) you would be right. But generally it has been seen that we are there to assist the RA with its activities which would be section 19(2)b.

Although AVC is mandated to check on the other WG, the climate for the last while in AVC has not been to do this work. AVC was not fulfilling this role. We've had a lot of trouble with WCom and ATDC but AVC tried to at least keep things in order within our group. The work you speak of interacting with GB and Secretary is usually the with of the ATDC and WCom. We agree that in an emergency like we have now, if we were more empowered, more skilled, had more time, then we should extend our duty and engage the GB. So far the Secretary has only met with us twice. We are not seen as an important group in the eyes of the GB or the Secretary. We don't think it's fair for you to ask us to step down because we are still fulfilling most of our function as a group of the RA. We showed up to this meeting when no other major WG has. We're trying our best. It's disappointing to hear that after all the work we have done that someone would ask us to resign largely for not doing what typically is not our work.

You say it's not about being neutral. But what has allowed the Council to stick together is to really try to respect each other's opinions as much as possible although they can be very different. It has not been about choosing one side or the other, but more about seeing how we can fulfill our role as best as we can.

Ashok:

Unless the community is united, there is not much we can do about the building of infrastructure. See what Dreamweaving can do. AvC has trouble when issues arise, they have a hard time implementing it? Why? Because there is no trust. We all have to surrender to the Divine force. Otherwise we will keep on fighting.

Gundolf:

Happy to read the quote from Mother on the screen "The city the earth needs, the purpose of Auroville is to realize human unity"

But I'm sad to hear our house is burning, but we need a new tool. Listening to Kireet Joshi and the 4 points from the Charter should be used as the bonding element/tool when signing a new mandate.

Q: Are you ready to become a firefighter with the RA?

R: We are constantly fire fighting

• Elvira:

Gratitude and appreciation for being committed and united as a team. Most people don't realize what you mean when you say you have been united.

But in the present situation and looking at it globally, it is not enough what the Council is doing.

Since the Council exists, people will come with their problems. 9 years ago the Council was saying the same thing, same struggles. If we don't stop and ask ourselves why, what are we missing, going on spirals. No group can save the RA. Just because you exist people will not take their own responsibility. Because you are filing for a power position you do not allow the RA to stand up, this will only happen when there is no one to point at. My wish is that you relieve yourself from saving all of us. Dare to just become part of the RA without being part of the Council. Any group that is not mentioned in the Foundation Act should dissolve.

Priya:

Agrees with what Elvira said. AvC mandate is to make sure that groups are functioning. If WCom and TDC are not functional or responding. Why aren't you going up and finding out.

R: Fair point. Claudine went up last week but maybe we should have been more proactive instead of waiting for the response.

• Someone say:

Maybe we should all go together.

R: Thing to understand is we also have had voices saying that ATDC are doing a good job. There's a broad spectrum of opinion on Council.

· Isa:

Some dictatorships work well. But that's not the point of what we are trying to do. It's not about the results but about the process we agreed upon. It's not because one person says it's good that it's good, it's important is what the mandate says.

R: We have to act as a group, difficult if the group is dispersed to act.

Someone says:

Why did you go up there (to Atdc)?

R: We said we should have gone up there but it was bizarre what was going on. We tried to find out what was going on at ATDC. We wrote a lot of mails, but they didn't respond. Claudine went up and nobody was there.

Priya:

If ATDC is not there it does not show that they are dysfunctional. And if you can agree on that then what is your role.

R: To get to the agreement that they are dysfunctional has been difficult. As a group we have not acknowledged that they are dysfunctional because some members don't think that. Whatever Council have said to ATDC has been pushed away. We have tried to get into conversation with them but they are all oriented towards the Secretary office. And they ignore what we say. We are not taken seriously. ATDC is a mess. It's been difficult because the Secretary is asking them to do certain things, another section is unhappy with what they are doing. So we didn't know how to implement it. Should we go up there and jump them and pull them out of the office? We believe in following the process as best as possible without creating chaos. In terms of ATDC issue (selection), that's the next RAD. So we saw light at the end of the tunnel. Should be in 2-3 weeks.

Edzard:

Thanks to all AvC members, they are trying their best and working hard. I resonate with what has been said by Mita, Natasha, Fabian and Claudine.

Much respect for those who stopped JCBs. This is action, instead of following a process where nothing gets done. Fabian has sent several questions. Can you please try to answer these questions?

In the past, when an Entry group made big mistakes, a group of 60 people went and told them that they are dismissed and they were dismissed. That was before the Secretary arrived.

Burning question is that visa recommendations have been given for shorter terms and this is the top priority. This will create a 2 class society in AV. It means that the Charter and Dream are not being followed. Because if you are so lucky to be born here you don't have these problems.

Rakhal:

Thanking Council. Very respectable meeting full of information. Apart from the presentation, Mita has brought up a very important point which needs to be verified. But we need to anticipate. There is a petition given to GB to meet with the RA and there is no answer.

The GB and Foundation office is ready to go completely without RA collaboration and consideration, if they can. But I think they fear something. We have power, we have to use it. As long as we are not in jail they will not lift a finger. I feel we should go to the ATDC office, to decide, to act. See for example the Dreamweaving process, nothing has happened. And it will not happen. Foundation will continue and when are we going to react.

• Joel:

Why don't we have multiple RADs at the same time? 5/6 can go in at the same time.

R: (by AVC and RAS): Too many simultaneous RADs will confuse the community. RAS together with Council are trying to speed up the process. Currently there are 2 RAD

processes ongoing and with the present policy we can't speed it up anymore. If you want the RA process to speed up, please participate in the RAD creation, and the RAD review process. We can improve and speed up RADs with the new review of the RAD process.

Sophie:

I want to thank all the people who are in groups, it's very easy to point the finger. In all groups there is division, it takes a lot of work to come to agreement within the group. To ask the Council to step down will not solve anything because who else will do it. We really lack the people with the skills and commitment to do the work.

First I'm questioning the legitimacy of the GB because none of the GB member profiles correspond to what they are supposed to be. How do we prioritize and see how to speed up processes or react when there is an emergency.

R: We need to meet more but also in a more silent and reflective way. These emergencies should not allow us to become hysterical. AvC has taken this question and will reflect on it. But the community should also reflect on how we can best respond to emergencies.

At the moment, as per the policy, only WCom are allowed to call emergency RADs which is questionable. Appointment of GB as per the criteria can be questions. There was a push from certain sections to delegitimize the RA and it's decisions. And we tried to stabilize things by following the process and supporting RAS. The poll on RADs had a similar intention. Most important for all of us is that we have systems to uphold the RA which also enable it to make decisions. And that these decisions are respected.

Sumeets

There is no mention in AvC mandate of power to ensure that people/WGs stick to any mandate. The RA is dysfunctional because we give mandates without the possibility to discharge the mandate. Our processes of decision making are too slow. 15 years ago there was no long RAD process, just a simple meeting. But the current process is not appropriate to the current circumstances. Is there anything in the act saying that RA cannot meet foundation or GB.

In our legal structure GB is the supreme body, and they are trying to bring the FAMC under them. ATDC have already said they will report at GB. Maybe it's better to have no groups if AVC has no power to implement. And even internally we can't agree with each other. We have created complicated processes and that's why we are in this mess. We are unable to speak in a coherent voice in an emergency. I respect that the Council had stuck together but at the cost of not meeting the emergency need. I question if we can have relevance as an RA if the GB gives contracts out. But at least we should be able to organize and speak with a common voice. Mother never wanted all these bodies. She wanted one group.

R: We are not as pessimistic as you are. We don't believe there is nothing that we can do. The RA has legal rights. We also don't think that we are entirely dysfunctional. Of course there's room for improvement but fundamentally that is what Auroville is about, trying to figure it out. Find new ways of doing things. You also suggest that Council should dissolve and of course if that's what the RA decides then yes. But the Council is fulfilling a specific role and doing a lot and without Council things might fall apart. The problem is more about implementation and how to organize. We're moving towards trying to organize better and that's what I must continue to do.

There is a way forward.

Q1: What would AVC need to strengthen implementation of your decisions?

R: We will need more time to consider this.

Q2: Is there a subgroup that handles feedback?

R: No, there are several areas where the Council needs strengthening, this is one of them. We hope to suggest some ways of improving this and other areas of our work soon.

Elvira

Requests Council to dissolve, to give the RA the space to self-organise and force the Aurovilians to take care of matters themselves.

R: We recognise the intention here is to allow the RA to organise better. But our feeling, especially at this current time with so much instability, is that it would be counterproductive to dissolve the Council, and that this is not in the interest of the RA at this time. In fact, we have been instrumental in ensuring the legitimacy of the RA via its processes in the past months.

Further we believe that we can help the RA to empower itself and to organise better. With this in mind we will make certain proposals and arrange future RA meetings.

In response to many community members wanting Council to be more pro-active in regard to the ATDC. AVC made a stronger effort insisting to meet with the ATDC.

AVC went to the ATDC office the following Friday 22nd after having sent reminders to our earlier request to meet throughout the week. Finally they agreed to meet on Tuesday 26th. We prepared a long list of questions received by the community. We were given 1 hour by ATDC, which was a little short. The minutes of that meeting will be published soon.

BCC NARRATIVE REPORT: JANUARY '22 - MARCH '22

Dear Community, the BCC would like to share with you a narrative report of issues addressed and decisions taken in January, February and March 2022 as a complement to our monthly report of income and expenses. We hope this can increase community-wide understanding of the economic issues affecting our community that fall within the BCC's scope of work.

Community-at-large matters:

City Services Budget for the upcoming year (April 2022 – March 2023): The BCC has made a call for new budget requests for the upcoming financial year 2022-2023. Existing and new services have submitted budget requests, which are being reviewed by BCC members and resource persons. These include budget requests from activities previously supported by SAIIER (with their Government of India grant funding). SAIIER has informed the BCC that these started out as projects but have turned into on-going activities and therefore are no longer appropriate for SAIIER funding. They have requested the BCC to consider supporting these from the City Services budget. These budgets are being reviewed in the same manner as all budget requests received.

Participatory Budgeting Process: In January & February 2022, the BCC together with resource persons lead a community budgeting process to help build the community's understanding of our current budgetary allocations, and to help the BCC better understand from the community whether the budget is being allocated in a way which meets community needs and aims. We also sought inputs regarding any key missing services in Auroville, and the

funding sources of the City Services budget. This process began with informational sessions open to all, followed by in-depth, facilitated feedback sessions with randomly selected participants, a presentation of the outcomes of these sessions, and then an opportunity for all to give additional feedback through a community survey. A full recap, with links to all sessions that were recorded, is available on Auronet: https://auroville.org.in/article/89471. The outcomes of this process have been published to the community in N&N and Auronet (https://auroville.org.in/article/90599), and presented to the FAMC, who is ultimately responsible for the City Services budget. The BCC is using the priority sectors and missing services outcomes in informing the upcoming annual City Services budget, and a BCC-FAMC subgroup is being formed to take forward the specific suggestions related to missing services and income sources to City Services. Some have already been taken up, such as reducing youth housing contributions. We will keep the community updated with our progress. Thank you for your interest and participation!

Climate Change – Friendly Budgets: The BCC received a suggestion from a community member to work towards "climate- change friendly" BCC budgets. This year, we have been encouraging services requesting a petrol/new 2-wheeler vehicle purchase budget to come back with an electrical vehicle rental budget instead. This is not only more climate-change friendly but also more affordable given the rise in petrol prices. The Aurovilian also suggested having a 'representative' on BCC dedicated to this "climate-change friendly" aspect. The BCC has followed up with the individual asking if they would be willing to take up this role/assist BCC in forming a support team for this. If community members wish to come forward and work on this, you are most welcome to contact us.

Visa Penalties & Other Costs: Some Aurovilians have incurred visa penalties due to delays in processing their visa requests. In cases where Aurovilians submitted their visa requests within the deadline given to them by the Residents' Service, the BCC is covering any penalty fees incurred. In cases where Aurovilians are required to leave the country due to visa issues, financial support may also be awarded on the basis of need.

Maintenances:

Advance on SAIIER Maintenances: SAIIER approached the BCC with a request to advance funds for SAIIER Project Maintenances for the months of January, February and March. This was due to an unforeseen delay in SAIIER receiving GOI grant funding. With this funding, SAIIER disburses the equivalent of 15 full-time Maintenances, primarily to the managers of the activities who are registered under SAIIER. The request was for a pre-financing of Rs. 1,5 Lakhs monthly towards disbursement of these Maintenances. This advance was granted, with the understanding that as soon as SAIIER receives its GOI funding, they will reimburse the amount to City Services and resume the direct disbursement of their Maintenances.

Auroville Foundation Office Maintenance List Request: The Auroville Foundation Office wrote to the BCC requesting Aurovilians' payment (Maintenance) details. Since the FAMC is the BCC's overseeing body, the BCC informed them of the request and sent them the list to communicate to AVFO as per their discretion.

Children's Maintenances paid by Auroville Units/Activities: In October 2021, the BCC changed the guidelines for Childrens' Maintenances. This financial support is now equally available to all our children, regardless of how their parents are contributing to Auroville. This change of policy more than doubles our numbers of eligible children and doubles the allocated monthly budget earmarked for Children's Maintenances. With this support now being available from the City Services budget, BCC Finance will transition away from booking as expenses any Children's Maintenances provided by Auroville Units/Activities. We encourage Aurovilians working in Units/Activities to apply for Children's

Maintenances directly with the BCC if needed (or to route these as specified contributions). While Units/Activities may offer a child a higher maintenance amount than the current City Services limit, this support will not be considered as an expense of the Unit or Activity. This is to ensure that as many children of Auroville as are in need can be supported by City Services funds.

Update on Temporary Emergency Maintenances: Temporary Emergency Maintenances are available to any Aurovilian who chooses to volunteer at a registered Auroville entity that has insufficient funds to support them with a Maintenance, and who is in financial need. As of March 22, 40 adults were supported with Temporary Emergency Maintenances (total budget of Rs. 4,68 lakhs/month, a 1 lakh reduction from the previous quarter). Children previously supported with Childrens' Maintenances tied to their parent's TEM, are now supported directly with Childrens' Maintenances as per the new Childrens' Maintenance guidelines.

In-kind scheme: The BCC has been looking into the possibility of modifying the In-Kind scheme (credit available at designated Auroville entities, such as PTDC/HERS/PTPS) components of the City Services Maintenance, as we have noted that when Aurovilians are in minus they do not have access to credit available in their In-Kind Scheme.

Management of Services:

City Services Unit update: Following months of exploration including conversations with auditors, the FAMC, and the AVFO Finance secretary, agreement was reached to revive the City Services unit. The FAMC temporarily nominated two BCC members (Danny & Rathinam) as executives till August 2022, for accounting purposes only. The FAMC will look into permanent executive nominations, since it was agreed that BCC members cannot be appointed as City Service unit executives (other than in an individual capacity). This is to ensure that the scope of work and authority of BCC members remains within their mandate.

Health Fund: The BCC has noted that the Health Fund is advising Aurovilians in need of extra refunds or expensive treatment to reach out to the BCC individually for financial support. We do not feel this is a good process, as BCC members are not as qualified and informed to review these requests as are the Health Fund members; we feel that the Health Fund should be the ones to request any amount they cannot cover. There is also the concern that the cost of treatment in hospitals is increasing, and the Health Fund would therefore like to encourage Aurovilians to go to Jipmer. However, Jipmer is a difficult hospital to navigate and a liaison/support person would be needed. This is currently being trialled.

Newcomer Fees: The BCC is exploring, along with the FAMC and Entry Board, the possibility of waiving or reducing the one time admin fee (Rs. 10,000) for Newcomers.

Solar Kitchen: A subgroup of BCC and FAMC members have been continuing to support the new Solar Kitchen Executive team in managing the service. This has included helping them to project their income and expenses for the upcoming year, and their required on-going budgetary support, based on the experience of the last 6 months running as a centrally supported service. Solar Kitchen was also advised to ask for rent from La Terrace unless / until they shift to being a service.

Meetings with other groups/services:

AVI-USA – Fundraising: At the occasion of his visit to Auroville, the BCC invited Matthew Andrews, the director of AVI-USA to our meeting. BCC expressed its gratitude for the fundraising efforts made by AVI-USA and shared the impact these donations had had in the past year, particularly in helping to support income-generating units for the first time (via the MERA relief grants) – up to now, income generating units have been the ones contributing to City Services). Matthew expressed that AVI-USA wish to continue to fundraise for City Services, and invited BCC to remember to reach out to them and stay in contact. He specifically shared that regular communications from BCC that could serve to keep donors updated would also be helpful. It was agreed that as a first step, BCC will communicate a report of the community budgeting process with AVI-USA to share. Fundraising for the Farms was also identified as the next potential campaign that AVI-USA could support.

Farm Group & FoodLink – Subsidy: A subgroup of the BCC met with members of the Farm Group and FoodLink to re-discuss the grant offered by BCC to cover the equivalent of a price increase requested by the Farm Group. This will go forward as previously agreed.

Farms – Investment Funding: BCC members have met with an Aurovilian donor, AVI-USA, and members of the Farm Group and Foodlink regarding investment funding for farms. This followed a request made to the BCC by the Farm Group for additional financial support to be awarded this year, primarily towards capital investment, and an Aurovilian donor offering 17 lakhs to support farms. The donor had reached out to members of the Farm Group and Food-Link for members for support in disbursing this. BCC members then met with both the donor and this team, offering to supplement this fund in collaboration with a fundraising campaign with AVI-USA, and to disburse it jointly. They had previously met with the director of AVI-USA who had committed to support this fundraising. The meetings were positive and we will continue to take this possibility forward together.

Health Fund: The Health Fund team requested a meeting with members of the BCC, which was held in October 2021, to share their concerns regarding the financial viability of the Health Fund. The BCC had already increased the Health Fund contribution portion of the City Services Maintenance, and reassured the Health Fund team that a further increase could be explored if needed (the Health Fund presently continues to have reserves). To reduce the costs associated with Aurovilians seeking care in private hospitals, a new service to direct and accompany people to quality care where available in government hospitals was imagined at this meeting, and is currently being trialled with various individuals.

Meeting Services during the Budgeting Process: BCC members have met with many services as part of the budgeting process for FY 22-23, to support them in creating and reviewing their budget requests.

Scholarship and Education Fund: The SEF team met with members of the BCC to discuss an update in their financial situation. They wished to inform the BCC that they received a large donation, but wish to use at least part of this for a corpus fund and therefore would still like to continue to request partial support from the City Services budget.

PCG Proposals: PCG approached the BCC regarding requests they are considering. They wished to ask whether BCC would consider these for City Services funding. Since some may require on-going support, and this support would likely be sought from City Services, they wished to include our review in considering whether or not to fund these requests. These requests were reviewed by BCC on a case-by-case basis.

Road Service: A subgroup of the BCC met with the Road Service management team to discuss the scope of budgeted repair work of the Road Service. Currently, the Road Service only repairs 'public' roads (i.e. not pathways inside communities) without charge (the costs being covered by their City Services budget). They do budgeted repair work only in

the Auroville MasterPlan area, up to the Outer Ring Road, although expanding this to the whole existing Auroville area is being explored. There is also still some defining needed regarding what is a 'public road' to be budgeted for.

Service Budgets:

ACARAT: On the request of the FAMC, the BCC approved an additional monthly budget of Rs. 10,000 towards speeding up the development of ACARAT (the Auroville Consolidated, Asset Registries and Application Tracker), an application designed to store and manage electronic records for Land, Building Applications and Commercial/Auroville Entities for Land Board, TDC and FAMC respectively.

Food Sector Research: A group of 4 Aurovilians came forward proposing to undertake a 3 months research project into establishing data management for Auroville's food sector. This was based on their observation of a huge gap in the communication capabilities between different stakeholders in this sector, and a lack of transferable data that would enable better planning for Auroville's food security. The request was for 2 half Maintenances for a period of 3 month in which they would look at what was done in the past, understand the needs and challenges of all the stakeholders, look at the current infrastructure and see how different tools / systems could fill some gaps. This was approved.

Pitanga: Pre-corona, Pitanga Cultural Centre was partially supported by guest income, receiving a monthly budget of Rs. 9,000 from BCC alongside Maintenances. The Pitanga executives approached BCC for additional support (Rs. 40,000 monthly) to cover the salaries of their employees, as their reserves are exhausted. This was approved and will be reviewed as part of the Pitanga budget request for FY 22-23.

Prosperity Area Coordinator: BCC received a request from a team of Aurovilians working to develop the infrastructure of the Prosperity area (Solar Kitchen complex) and coordinate amongst the Services housed within it. The request was for a ½ Maintenance towards a coordinator who would manage the upcoming extension of the Prosperity Building as well as work towards better sharing of resources amongst the services. This was approved for a 6 months period.

Sante Coordination: The BCC had approved a previous request from the Covid Task Force / Sante Coordination Team to support a Covid quarantine facility in Auroville (Bharat Nivas) with a budget of Rs. 29,000/month up to September 2021. The Sante Coordination team requested an extension till the end of the financial year (March 31, 2022), after which they plan to ask the Working Committee to close it down and replace it with a smaller operation. The request for this extension was approved.

Extra (non-recurring) budget requests:

ACUR: The ACUR (Town Hall) management team requested several lakh to undertake repairs of the building complex. The BCC requests that 3 estimates be provided to review and approve such large requests, and are waiting to receive these from ACUR. We additionally approached the original contractor to advise on the works proposed to be undertaken. A budget of Rs. 35,100 was also requested by ACUR to repurpose the space previously occupied exclusively by AVDzines, into two separate spaces, in order to be able to accommodate Savi. This request was approved. They also requested a monitor for the ACUR (Town Hall) reception, this is being followed up with Blue Light.

Adventure Community (continued): Adventure community submitted a budget request for a Road Service estimate of Rs. 107,125 for their path repairs. Given that they had close to half the amount in their communal account to be used towards such purposes, the BCC decided to support 50% of the requested budget, Rs. 88, 600. Typically Road Service path repairs within communities are not subsidised by City Services budget, support was granted only on the basis of the emergency flooding situation.

BCC Office: The BCC Office team requested a new computer for BCC Office. The required Rs. 34,711 was approved.

Buddha Garden: Buddha Garden requested a grant of Rs. 18,000 towards renting access to their farm via non-Auroville land. This was due to a conflict situation with their neighbouring Auroville farm (Siddharta Farm) which had resulted in their no longer being able to share access via Auroville land. As this matter was currently following an arbitration process, the outcome of which would likely include decisions from the arbiters on who ought to to pay what amount for what purpose (potentially funding from the City Services budget), the BCC decided to await the outcome of the arbitration.

Dehashakti sports ground: Rs.12,000 has been approved for fence repair.

Electrical Service: The Electrical Service requested emergency funding of Rs. 2 lakhs for the Matrimandir HT transformer and HT cable termination kit. BCC approved their request.

Farms: The BCC received several requests for support from individual farms: from Ayarpadi farm for a collapsed borewell, Alipsa farm for replacement of chickens due to flooding, Manvasam for a solar pump. The BCC requires the endorsement of the Farm Group for such requests, based on the priorities for the sector, given that many farms are in need. So far, the Farm Group has endorsed the request from Ayarpadi. Given that the request is for a borewell, the endorsement of the TDC and Water Group is needed as well and is currently being sought.

Foodlink: FoodLink submitted the amount to be covered by BCC towards the sales of Auroville farm produce. It was previously agreed that the BCC would cover an amount equivalent to the proposed price raise, to avoid this increase being pushed to Auroville consumers. The requested Rs. 134,003 was disbursed.

Solar Kitchen: The Solar Kitchen team requested a chapati-making machine with a value of Rs. 5,39,850. This was approved.

Matrimandir Flowers: The Matrimandir flower offerings team requested approximately Rs. 60,000 for flower offerings for February 21st and 28th, Rs. 30,000 was approved.

Matrimandir: The Matrimandir team requested Rs. 70,000 for the February 28th bonfire breakfast. BCC has approved Rs. 25,000 based on last year's request with a little increase for inflation. (Last year's approved request was Rs. 23,450).

News and Notes: The N&N team requested an additional monitor and keyboard for a value of Rs.15,325, to enable one of their team members to work from home on the days preceding publication which require long working hours. This was approved.

Pongal Bonus budget request: A few services approached BCC with Pongal bonus requests for their employees. These amounts were granted on the basis of the financial situation of the service (i.e. their reserves). Typically bonus amounts should be included by services in their annual budget requests to BCC.

Prosperity Building extension: A team of Aurovilians secured a large donation (1 crore) towards the extension of the Prosperity building (Solar Kitchen area), specifically the addition of a second floor to the building currently housing PTDC, Nandini and Free Store. However, construction is significantly delayed due to a tendering process, and the team foresee that the donation, which is currently deposited in the Unity Fund, will lose its value and will not be sufficient to complete the project. They approached BCC requesting a grant equivalent to the value lost, if needed to complete the project. The BCC offered to cover up to 15% of the original donation (Rs. 15 lakhs) if needed, given that the project supports essential budgeted services of Auroville.

BCC Finance

Neem Tree: The Neem Tree Executives have agreed to begin paying City Services contributions, as expected from all eateries, including their pending contributions due. Previously they had expressed that they felt they should be exempted given that they provided a service to the community in the form of a low cost eatery.

Dental refund expenses: Aurovilians receiving a City Services Maintenance are refunded for dental expenses if incurred at the Auroville Dental Centre, or elsewhere if there is an endorsement from the Dental Centre to do so for the purposes of special treatment. For Aurovilians working in units, it was agreed that dental work will be considered an expense of the unit as long as the same process is followed: for it to be considered an expense the dental work should either be undertaken by the Dental Centre or outside on the recommendation of the Dental Centre. Where units/activities cannot afford to cover the dental costs of the Aurovilians working within them, these individuals can approach BCC Care for financial support.

Internal BCC team updates:

BCC Secretariat: Mathan (BCC) resigned as secretary of the BCC on March 31st, 2022 and was replaced by Chloe Tadiotto.

BCC Finance: A support group has been created for BCC Finance, consisting of Ellie (BCC Checkpoint), Lisa (FAMC), Mahi (BCC), Sheida (BCC Finance), Suryamayi (BCC), Ulli (FARG), to help create guidelines relating to BCC Finance work and address exceptional cases.

New BCC members: Following a call to the community for candidates to the BCC, the FAMC selected Verena (working at RAS) to join the BCC team in February 2022 and Sacha to join the BCC in March 2022.

Resignation of a BCC member: Fabien (Mason & Co), who joined the BCC team in June 2021, chose to resign in March 2022 as he was finding it difficult to give time to BCC work and did not wish to affect BCC's functioning as a result. We thank Fabien for having joined our team and for his valuable inputs, and hope that other young executives will find interest in BCC work in future.

Extra weekly meeting: The BCC has added an additional weekly meeting, currently dedicated to the budgeting for FY 22-23.




